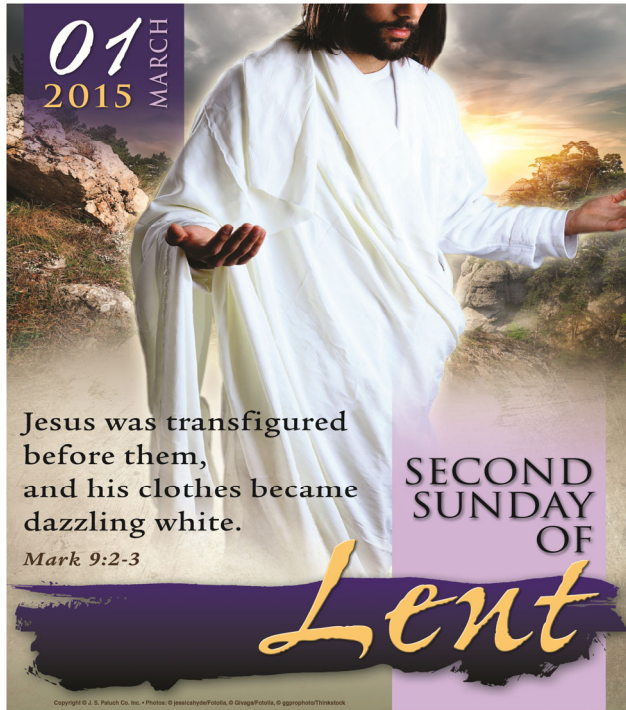

Well, hopefully we're not going to have to dig out from anymore weather! Wow, what a Saturday we had last week. It made for a busy and memorable weekend. First, I must commend our maintenance crew for coming in at all hours of the morning and evening to clear the pathways and make St. Joseph's accessible (and safe). I'm sure that even though it was Lent, after that Saturday they probably had a few choice thoughts about that groundhog from Punxsatawny. If you see any of them around the property, say thank you for all the behind the scenes work they do for us.

I do have to admit that I do like snow. Not simply because it reminds me of Christmas, but also because of the way it makes things look. When it first floats down it makes everything seem clean and crisp. But then...then comes the disruptions, the slush, the messiness of it all. I recall the newly canonized St. John Paul II who once corrected someone who said the youth are the future of the Church. He said that this statement was incorrect, and should be restated as "the youth ARE the Church." He is so right, this is their Church, and we need the energy and vitality that they bring. So, a special 'Thank You' goes to the parents, sponsors and the catechists of our 8th graders for passing on the faith and for helping them to become full members of the Catholic Church.

Keeping
a Holy Lent

During Lent, in addition to the daily 6:30 a.m., 8 a.m. and 12:15 p.m. Masses, Stations of the Cross will be on Fridays at 7 p.m., 8:00 p.m. in Spanish.

The Lenten Rules for Fast and Abstinence are:

- 1) Lent is to be observed by Catholics as a special season of prayer, penance, and works of charity.
- 2) Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the most important penitential days of the liturgical year. They are days of both fast and abstinence. All Fridays in Lent are days of abstinence.
- 3) The rules for fasting are that only one full meal a day can be taken. Two small meals, 'sufficient to maintain strength,' are allowed but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals breaks the fast, but drinking liquids does not. The rule of fasting obliges Catholics from 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th year.
- 4) Abstinence refers to refraining from eating meat. The rule of abstinence binds all Catholics age 14 years and older.
- 5) The substantial observance of the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious obligation. Those whose work or whose health would be impaired are excused from fasting and abstaining.

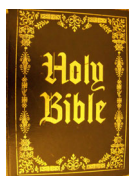

WHAT IS ST. JOSEPH HOMEBOUND OUTREACH?

St. Joseph Outreach is comprised of teams that provide assistance to the homebound of St. Joseph Parish. A summary of our Teams:

The Assessment Team visits with the homebound, determines where assistance is needed and coordinates a plan with the other teams.

Eucharistic Ministers bring Eucharist to the homebound, as well as parishioners in hospitals or nursing homes within St. Joseph boundaries.

The Home Visit Team visits the homebound, as well as hospitals and nursing homes, for fellowship, prayer and a sense of community.

The Meal Team provides a simple family meal three times a week for a 2-3 week period, as needed.

The Phone Visits Team keeps in touch with the homebound to coordinate any needs and to check on their welfare.

The Prayer Team prays for the homebound, parishioners and our priests.

The Transportation Team provides transportation for doctor visits, Mass and Church related activities, and personal errands, as volunteers are available.
