EASTER Blessings

Peace and good! As we celebrate the Easter Season and Jubilee of Mercy, let us continue to pause to reflect upon God's gift of mercy. What exactly is mercy? Pope Francis offers the following insights and reflections on the virtue of mercy:

In last Sunday's Gospel [Divine Mercy Sunday], the Apostle Thomas personally experiences this mercy of God. Thomas does not believe it when the other Apostles tell him: "We have seen the Lord." And how does Jesus react? With patience: Jesus does not abandon Thomas in his stubborn unbelief ... He does not close the door, He waits. And Thomas acknowledges his own poverty, his little faith. "My Lord and my God!" With this simple yet faith-filled invocation, he responds to Jesus' patience. He lets himself be enveloped by Divine Mercy; he sees it before his eyes, in the wounds of Christ's hands and feet and in His open side, and he discovers trust.

Let us ... remember Peter: three times he denied Jesus, precisely when he should have been closest to him; and when he hits bottom he meets the gaze of Jesus who patiently, wordlessly, says to him: "Peter, don't be afraid of your weakness, trust in Me." Peter understands, he feels the loving gaze of Jesus and he weeps. How beautiful is this gaze of Jesus – how much tenderness is there! Brothers and sisters, let us never lose trust in the patience and mercy of God!

I am always struck when I reread the parable of the merciful Father. The Father, with patience, love, hope and mercy, had never for a second stopped thinking about [his wayward son], and as soon as he sees him still far off, he runs out to meet him and embraces him with tenderness, the tenderness of God, without a word of reproach. God is always waiting for us, He never grows tired. Jesus shows us this merciful patience of God so that we can regain confidence and hope – always!

God's patience has to call forth in us the courage to return to Him, however many mistakes and sins there may be in our life. It is there, in the wounds of Jesus, that we are truly secure; there we encounter the boundless love of His heart. Thomas understood this. Saint Bernard goes on to ask: But what can I count on? My own merits? No, "My merit is God's mercy. I am by no means lacking merits as long as He is rich in mercy. If the mercies of the Lord are manifold, I too will abound in merits." This is important: the courage to trust in Jesus' mercy, to trust in His patience, to seek refuge always in the wounds of His love. (Homily, April 7, 2013)

The message of The Divine Mercy is simple, yet powerful and grace-filled. It is that God loves us – all of us. May we have the courage to proclaim, "My Lord and my God!"

Parish Advisory Council (PAC)
Executive Summary of the Minutes
March 17, 2016**

In attendance: Fr. Tom, Mark Overberg (Chairperson), Jennie Albers (Secretary), Greg Bengzon, Marylou Bergeron, Frank Bowen, Cindi Conroy, Terry McNulty, Patty Navarro, Tom Reilly, Cheryl Wilson. Absent: Jim Nash.

Fr. Tom welcomed the members of the newly formed PAC. He received 45 nominations for membership, and another 20 parishioners volunteered to serve if needed. Fr. Tom gave an overview of the PAC's role and his vision for what the PAC might accomplish. He explained that the PAC is an advisory body that represents the parishioners. The members were selected because they represent both the broad demographic nature of the parish and the ministries that serve it. The Council is not involved in the everyday management of the parish. Fr. Tom said the parish staff and he oversees the operations. The Council's role is to help him learn and prioritize the needs of the parish. The PAC investigates and ponders pastoral matters, draws sound conclusions and proposes practical solutions to the pastor.

Fr. Tom shared that a third full time friar is due in June, but he will continue to empower the laity to help out where possible. For example, the Stations of the Cross were recently led by laity. This is to allow the friars' to spend most of their time in sacramental ministry and ministry of Catholic education in the parish religious education program and Saint Joseph Catholic School.

Fr. Tom intends to invite parish staff to review their ministerial/functional areas with the PAC, so the PAC can gain a better understanding of their ministry/responsibilities.

Fr. Tom reviewed the parish's draft mission and vision statements. He explained the process of developing and reviewing the statements with the last PAC, the parish staff, and the parish at large. Fr. Tom asked the PAC for any final input before finalizing the statements after Easter.

Mark Overberg reviewed the draft PAC Charter. The Charter will explain the PAC's composition, selection, and purpose as well as how it will work and report its work to the parish. He asked the members to review and comment. The charter will become a public document when completed. Mark noted that he is not the PAC President. As Chairperson, he organizes and facilitates the work of the Council, while Fr. Tom presides over the PAC. Fr. Tom asked the PAC members to be servant leaders of the parish.

One of the PAC's first challenges is to determine how best to communicate with the parish -- how to encourage input from parishioners and how to explain their work to the parish. The PAC email (pac@sjcherndon.org) does not receive many emails. Most input comes through word of mouth.
