

#### REFLECTION

#### MEDITATION OF THE 3rd SUNDAY OF LENT:

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, God witnessed the affliction of the people of Israel in Egypt and heard their cry against their slave drivers. He decided to rescue them from the hands of the Egyptians and lead them out of that land into a good and spacious land flowing with milk and honey. For that purpose, He called Moses whom He sent on mission to go and liberate the people. For Moses to be taken seriously, He had to say who sent him. That is why God will reveal Himself to him and tell him to say to the people that it is "the Lord, the God of their fathers, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob" who sent him to them. It is not any other God. We too need to know to which God some people want to lead us at times. Is it the True God or any other one?

When St. Paul re-reads the history of Israel, he notices that among the people led by Moses some were not always faithful to God even though they all ate the same spiritual food and drink. That is why God was not pleased with them and struck them down in the desert. We are told that these things happened as examples for us so that we might not desire evil things. These experiences shed some light on the sufferings and miseries of some of us. Sometimes, we too are struck down because of our sins or of our grumblings and impatience with God. That is why we need to repent as Jesus tells us in the Gospel, otherwise we too will all perish.

Let us pray that God should grant us the grace to repent and turn back to Him in a special way, especially during this time of Lent.

#### **CATECHESIS**

Faith also comes as a result of a religious experience where we really feel the presence and action of God in our life. We should be re-reading our history in order to see how God has showed us his love by saving us from difficult situations or by operating miracles in our lives and the lives of our dear ones. Those experiences of the past should strengthen our faith and give us a reason to believe in God more. Even if we are suffering now, even if we are going through tough times at the moment, we do not forget that God is present and attentive to us, that we have to commit our life to Him and He will act at His appointed time for our good. This conviction makes our faith stronger and gives us every reason to believe despite everything. Keep the Faith! Courage!


