

CORPUS CHRISTI SUNDAY REFLECTION

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, last Sunday, we learned about God. Today we continue to discover who He is in the person of the Son. The Word of God reveals something about Him and about Man. The Gospel shows us how Jesus is sensitive to the needs of the people, and works to come to their help readily; but the attitude of man, visible in the reaction of the apostles, is different. They want Jesus to dismiss the crowd so that they can go and get something for themselves in the surrounding villages and farms because they are in a deserted place. It is interesting to see how Jesus reacted before them: "Give them some food yourselves." And the apostles answered: "five loaves and two fish are all we have, unless we ourselves go and buy food for all these people." This dialogue between Jesus and the apostles reveals two attitudes, two ways of looking at things: Jesus' sensitivity and man's indifference, as they wanted Him to send the people away for each to go and fend for himself. That is exactly how we are in the world today, very individualistic and egoistic, not sensitive to the needs of those around us. We tend to undermine what we have and do not want to share the little we have with others either out of greed or because we deem it is not enough for us: therefore, we cannot be sharing with others. We forget that the little we have can be multiplied by God who provides. We want to rely on ourselves and we forget that it is God who blesses even the little we have and who grants satisfaction to people. Just as it is difficult for us to give what we have to help others; it is even more difficult to give a bit of ourselves to some people. In the feast of today, we see how Jesus does not only give things to help people, but gives Himself, his Body and Blood, not only for the nourishment of people, but also for their salvation. We who are his followers should also be able to sacrifice ourselves for the good of others as well. That is our challenge as Christians. Let us beg God to grant us the grace for that!

CATECHESIS

The providence of God: Our God is a providential God, that is a God who sees the needs of man and who provides. That is why Jesus often tells us that even before we open our mouth to pray or make a request to God, He already knows what we need. In the gospel of today, we see that the crowd did not make any request to Jesus; they did not complain at all; but Jesus knew that they were hungry, that they needed to eat something and that not all of them had the means to buy anything. That is why "He provided." But He did so from what they had: five loaves and two fish. God uses the little we have to provide for the needs of others. That is why we should be generous and allow God to bless others through us and with the little we have. This is only possible if we offer ourselves with what we are and with what we have for Him to use as instruments of His grace for people. Only then shall we have more blessings, more graces in return, just as the apostles who had twelve baskets left over. Let us therefore not forget that God provides!
