

# **REFLECTION OF THE 15TH SUNDAY "C"**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ, the question "What must i do to inherit eternal life?" should be asked and answered by each of us every day. In fact, the scholar of the law in the gospel passage of today gives us the answer: "to love God with all our heart, with all our being, with all our strength and with all our mind, and to love our neighbor as ourselves." Yes, the love of God and the love of neighbor constitute our assurance for eternal life; but unfortunately, we do not always respect this law of God. "If only you would heed the voice of the Lord your God and keep his commandments and statutes..." (Dt. 30.10). Unfortunately, we change the order of things. We claim to love God whereas we love man first with all our heart, with all our being, with all our strength and all our mind to the point that we are ready to defend and fight for those we love or cherish (our parents, our wife, our husband, our children, our friends, our properties, etc...) and yet we are not ready to fight in the same way for God or the things of God. Not only that we do not love God as we ought to, but also that we do not love all our neighbors properly. That is why Jesus had to tell the parable of the Good Samaritan to teach us that we have to love our neighbors by showing compassion even to those who are different or considered enemies (like Samaritans and Jews). We should be asking ourselves what is the quality of our love for our neighbors or others, for our enemies? The Good Samaritan was able to stop and show mercy and compassion to the Jew whereas their two people were enemies. Can we do the same with our enemies?

# **CATECHESIS**

Love of God and love of neighbor: These are two sides of the same coin. The love of God is first and absolute: "with all our heart, with all our being, with all our strength, and with all our mind." The love of God demands no reservation. The love of neighbor comes second and is in comparison with the love of ourselves in a positive sense, i.e we will love others with the love we have for ourselves. But although the love we have for God should come first and should be above any other, we tend to love man and other things first in the world, more than God. That is why we find many people who are not balanced. When they don't have God first, they go mad when they lose your loved one, their car, their money, their house, their property, ... any creature or thing they deem dear to them. He who has God as his "ALL" will look at everything in the world differently, with a spirit of detachment. He will not fight nor go mad because someone else has taken his wife or husband, or because he has lost his children or his properties. Job understood that well. Shall we have the same attitude like him and say: "Naked I came from my mother's womb and naked shall I return. The Lord gave, and the Lord has taken away. Blessed be the name of the Lord." (Job1:21)? Let us ask for the grace to love God above all.
