



#### A Transition of Sacrament of Confirmation

He further asked each individual parish to determine a proper transition plan for administration of the sacrament. We have received many inquiries about the transition from concerned parents and candidates. Our youth formation team and leadership team has developed a transition plan for St. Pius, and the transition will begin this fall with our juniors in high school, followed by the sophomores in the spring.







# St. Rita - May 22

Saint Rita was born Margherita Lotti in Roccaporena, Italy in 1381. St. Rita died on May 22, 1457 at the age of 76. At an early age, she begged her parents to allow her to enter a convent but was instead arranged to be married to a cruel man named Paolo Mancini. Young Rita became a wife and mother at only twelve years of age and her husband was a man of violent temper. Rita and her husband had two sons. Paolo often mistreated Rita verbally and physically. He was also known to pursue other women and he had many enemies.

In the troubling political climate of the times, there was often open conflict between families. Paolo was the victim of one such conflict, and he was murdered when their sons were still young. The expectation of society at the time was that the boys should avenge the murder of their father to defend the family honor. Rita, however, influenced by the peacemaking example of her parents, pledged to forgive her husband's killers. She faced a steep challenge, however, in convincing her sons to do the same. Tradition has it that she often pointed out to them the image of the crucified Christ and the fact that he forgave those who killed him. Within a year, however, both sons succumbed to a deadly illness leaving Rita not only a widow, but also childless.

Rita pardoned her husband's killers and because she was now widowed, Rita was free to satisfy a holy desire of her youth and entered an Augustinian convent. The leadership of the local Augustinians was reluctant to admit Rita, however, because she was not a virgin. Despite wide precedence for widows entering religious life, Rita was compelled to wait a number of years before receiving the habit.

Saint Rita was both a physical and a spiritual mother. She was a spouse of Christ—a perfect man, and of her husband—a flawed man. She knew intimately the vocation both to religious and to married life, giving her a certain status, or credibility, with both consecrated and married women, which few others saints enjoy.

In the convent, St. Rita's life was marked by great charity and severe penances. Her prayers obtained for others remarkable cures, deliverance from the devil and other special favors from God. So that she might share in the pain of His Crown of Thorns, Our Lord gave St. Rita a thorn wound in her forehead. It was very painful and gave off a disagreeable odor, yet she considered it a very great grace. She prayed, "O loving Jesus, increase my patience accordingly as my sufferings increase." The wound lasted the rest of her life.

If you are facing a difficult or impossible life circumstance, you can have recourse to prayer after the example of St. Rita. She is the patroness of impossible causes and hopeless circumstances because of her difficult and trying life.


