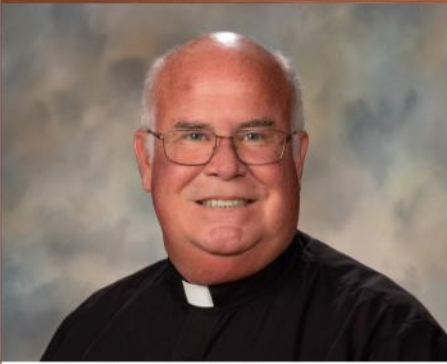

Labor Day

Tomorrow we celebrate Labor Day, and we hope you have a good holiday. Please be reminded that morning Mass will be at 7:30 a.m. with Confession at 7:00 a.m., and there will NOT be a 12:05 p.m. Mass that day.

Labor Day is a good time for us to reflect on what the Church and Sacred Scripture convey to us about the work and responsibilities entrusted to us in our daily lives. Initially, work was part of human life before The Fall, as Adam and Eve were settled in the garden to care for and cultivate it.

As a result of The Fall, work became difficult and oppressive (Gn 3:16-19). **However, in the Salvation brought by Jesus, labor has been redeemed, having a salvific effect, and can be a necessary, liberating, fruitful and fulfilling part of our lives if done well and with the right attitude and perspective.**

The Labor Day holiday reminds me of a short examination that can help us to reflect on the work entrusted to us by God. Although it is intended for business leaders, it is certainly applicable to others, including parents, employees, homemakers, volunteers or any other work we do in our daily lives. **I hope it is helpful to all of us in transforming our labors from oppressive and burdensome to liberating and salvific.**

- Do I see my work as a gift from God?
- How is this reflected in my attitude at work?
- Do I see my work as part of my Christian vocation?

- Do I promote a culture of Gospel values in my work?
- Do I live a divided life, where I separate Gospel principles from my work?
- Do I receive the sacraments regularly and with attention to how they support and inform my work practices?
- Am I taking seriously the dignity of the person, myself and others in my work?
- Am I being just in my attentiveness to my personal performance?

Let us pray that with the help of God's Grace we are able to live more closely to the fullness of the Gospel that Jesus not only taught us, but modeled for us.

Finally, let us surround in prayer our brothers and sisters who are unemployed or without work, praying that they will soon find employment not only to provide for their economic needs, but also for the fullness of the dignity God has given them.

Join Our Children's Choir or Adult Choir

The adult and children's choirs will soon be returning to our 9:00 and 10:30 Mass, so this means that now is your opportunity to join one of our musical groups.

The Children's Choir meets on Wednesdays from 5:30 - 6:15 and sings once a month, usually the last Sunday of the month from September or October through April. They also sing at the Christmas Eve Mass at 6:00 pm. We welcome children of reading age - middle school.

The Adult Choir is for anyone 18 years +. This choir sings every Sunday at the 10:30 Mass as well as Christmas Eve at 10:00 PM and during Holy Week. There are no auditions, except to assign vocal placement, (soprano, alto, tenor, or bass) and it is not required that members read music to be a part of this group. We rehearse every Wednesday from 7:00-8:30. Start dates for these groups should be in early September, depending on the installation of the sound system, so we will announce in the bulletin as soon as we know for sure. We plan to begin on September 6th, if possible.

Our worship experience in Mass is enhanced by our full and active participation which includes singing, so we encourage everyone to fully participate through singing. "He who sings," said St. Augustine, "prays twice." The holy Bishop of Hippo stated that singing adds to our praise and worship of God; that our voices are gifts with which we can make music to the Lord and express the joy of our heart. Sung prayer reminds us of the choirs of heaven, with whom we are called to praise God eternally.

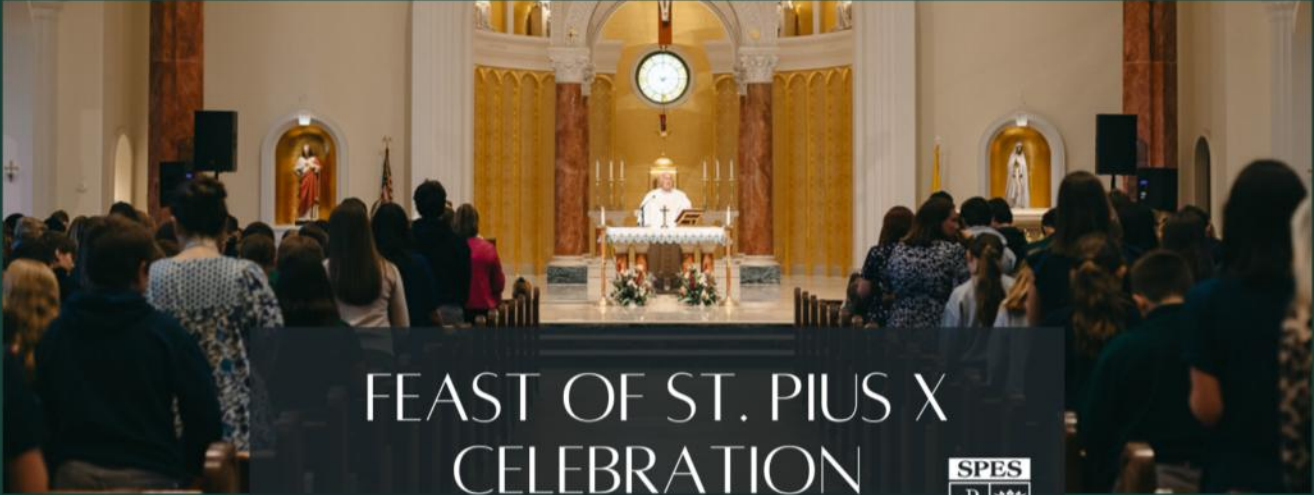

Saint of the Week



Saint Teresa of Calcutta

September 5

Saint Teresa of Calcutta (known as Mother Teresa) was an Albanian-born Indian Roman Catholic missionary and nun who devoted her life to helping those most in need. She founded the Missionaries of Charity in India in 1950, and for over 45 years, she ministered to the poor, sick, orphaned and dying. At the time of her death she ran over 500 missions in over 100 countries, including hospices and homes for people with HIV/AIDS, leprosy and tuberculosis; soup kitchens; family and children's counseling programs; orphanages and schools.

Inspired by Jesus' words in the Gospel, *"I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me,"* Mother Teresa worked to serve "the poorest of the poor" on the streets of Calcutta. She gave away all of her possessions and lived in dire poverty with them in hopes of being better able to serve them. Mother Teresa's work was not easy. The conditions of the streets were deplorable and the poor she sought to help had no way out of their situations. She took it upon herself to provide those in need with a path forward. She did this by teaching them valuable skills that gave them a way to earn money and get back on their feet. She taught them tailoring, soap-making, basket-weaving, and candle-making, so they could earn money for themselves and their families.

During her lifetime, Mother Teresa became the world's most recognizable symbol of selfless charity. She dedicated herself to lifting up the vulnerable people that had been cast out and overlooked by society. Mother Teresa treated everyone with compassion and supported them regardless of their religious beliefs or social status. Her efforts helped millions of people who were suffering from disease, poverty, homelessness and starvation.

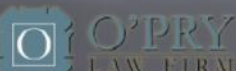
