Pope declares, by decree, three new saints

VATICAN CITY (CNS) -Without a canonization ceremony, Pope Francis declared 3 new saints for the Americas, pioneers of the Catholic Church in Brazil and in Canada.

Pope Francis signed decrees recently recognizing: St. Jose de Anchieta, a Spanish-born Jesuit who traveled to Brazil in 1553 and became known as the Apostle of Brazil; St. Marie de l'Incarnation, a French Ursuline who traveled to Quebec in 1639 and is known as the Mother of the Canadian Church; and St. Francois de Laval, who arrived in

Quebec 20 years after St. Marie de l'Incarnation and became the first bishop of Quebec.

In declaring the saints, the pope used a procedure known as 'equivalent canonizations,' which required a thorough study of the candidates' life and writings, fame of holiness, and reports of favors granted through their intercession. Unlike a regular sainthood process, though, it did not require the verification of a miracle through their intercession, nor further studies by historians and theologians working for the Congregation for Saints' Causes.

The 3 were beatified together by Pope John Paul II in 1980.





At the ordination ceremony, Bishop Fellhauer offers a blessing and the newly ordained six lay prostrate during the Litany of Saints. Ordained to serve, gather, transform, and send those who receive the sacrament of holy orders- as a deacon priest or bishop- are consecrated in Christ's name 'to feed the church by the word and grace of $oldsymbol{\mathsf{God}}.^2$

On May 24, 2014 at Our Lady of Victory, Victoria, the sacrament of holy orders was conferred upon Deacon Philip Brune and Deacon Jasper Liggio as they entered into the priesthood of Jesus Christ. The ordination of Kristopher Fuchs, Scott Hill, Jacob Koether, and Francis Nguyen III to the sacred order of the diaconate was also held. Ordination of the six on the same day was a first in the history of the diocese. Main celebrant was the Most Rev. David E. Fellhauer. Concelebrants included priests of the Diocese of Victoria. Afterwards, a reception was held at Holy Family Catholic Church's parish hall.

> Way of St. James (last of a *TCL* 4-part series)

Why do the Camino? What is the point of walking 500 miles across Spain? Can't you just take a car? Couldn't you just fly there? Everyone has a reason to walk the ancient pilgrimage and everyone has to figure out the purpose of such a journey. If you do not, you are reminded of it with every painful step- why did I decide to do this?

I had heard about the Camino de Santiago, or the Way of St. James, like many people by watching the movie The Way, a film made in 2010 with Martin Sheen and Emilio Estevez. I was attracted to the idea of doing the pilgrimage because of the way the movie presented it; a beautiful and challenging adventure. As I began preparing for it, both physically and spiritually, my reasons for walking the path became more focused. Initially, I wanted to offer the Camino as a thanksgiving for all the blessings I had received in my pastoral year, as a preparation for my diaconate and priestly ordinations, as a means of growing in my relationship with God, and as a prayer for all those who helped me throughout my vocational journey.

I approached the Camino as a teacher. I considered everything along the Way to be a symbol that told me about God, myself, and my relationships with others. For instance, a foggy, cold, wet, and dark morning was an image of what sin and selfishness does to our souls; a warm, sunny day was God's grace and love; the thick, heavy mud that stuck to our shoes and made the trek difficult was a sign of the things in life that weigh us down and distract us; my walking stick was a symbol of prayer which kept me grounded and balanced, connected to the Way, who is Christ.

What stood out to me the most about what I learned on the Camino was that it was a lot like life. There are valleys, mountains, plateaus, good weather days, and bad weather days. There are times when we feel like we are really making progress and times when it feels like no matter how hard we try, we're going nowhere. The important thing is that no matter what we might be going through, we must remember to stay on the path and keep walking. Every moment we are moving, we are getting closer to our goal and God is with us every step of the Way.







A garden for reflection
