America: The Story of Us

This is a one-year survey course of American History from the formation of the American colonies through Reconstruction. With an emphasis on the people within this period, the course looks at social aspects, political trends, economic development, and conflicts throughout the time period. The course examines various historical events by introducing elements of critical thinking, while beginning the use of primary sources and documentaries. Students will apply the skills of effective note taking, test preparation, and research/development of individual and group projects. Various documentaries that apply to the person/time period being studied will be an integral part of the weekly curriculum. From these films, they will participate in class discussions by utilizing critical thinking skills. Various class projects include Google slide presentations, using Publisher to create informational brochures and posters, and a "Historically Themed" newsletter of a variety of topics (Women in History, Black History, American Explorers, etc).

Class Rules and Expectations

- 1. <u>Be prepared</u> by having all required materials (text, homework, pen/pencil, paper). *Late work will be marked down 10%.*
- 2. <u>Cheating is unacceptable.</u> Work will be given a "zero" and parents called.
