Dearly Beloved in Christ,

Holy Week is a time that is set apart in our Church's **liturgical year** for our spiritual renewal. In fact, the word *holy* refers to anything that is set apart for God's purposes. Holy Week is holy precisely because it is time that is set apart for us to focus on how we are spiritually renewed through the suffering, death, and Resurrection of Jesus.

The Symbols of Holy Week

The liturgies of Holy Week are filled with some of the richest and most ancient symbols of the Catholic faith. The **waving of palms** on Passion (Palm) Sunday reminds us that we are called to be followers of Jesus, not just fans who cheer from a distance. The **washing of feet** on Holy Thursday speaks to us of the selfless love that we are called to practice in imitation of Jesus. The **veneration of the cross** on Good Friday reminds us that, as Christians, we believe that Jesus can overcome anything, even death. **The lighting of the Easter fire** in a darkened church and the **celebration of baptisms** on Holy Saturday speak to us of the new life that is ours because of Jesus' triumph over the darkness of sin and death through his resurrection.

Holy means "set apart." Christians set apart an entire week — Holy Week — to recall events surrounding the Suffering, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus. We celebrate the Paschal Mystery in an intentionally intense way over the Paschal Triduum — the sacred "three days" leading up to and encompassing Easter Sunday. The Paschal Triduum is to the entire year what Sunday is to the week.

What exactly is the Paschal Triduum?

The Paschal Triduum is a single liturgical celebration that spans three days. It begins on the Thursday before Easter and ends the evening of Easter Sunday. "Isn't that four days?" you might ask. The Church counts these days liturgically, so the "day" begins the evening before. (Remember, "evening came, and morning followed, the first day" from

Genesis). Thus: Thursday evening to Friday evening (Day 1), Friday evening to Saturday evening (Day 2), Saturday evening to Sunday evening (Day 3).

The Paschal Triduum is a single liturgy encompassing all three days. It is not three separate liturgies. This is best seen when all three days are celebrated physically in the same church.

At the end of the Mass on Holy Thursday, you'll notice there is no final blessing or dismissal. All are invited to join in the Eucharistic Procession to the Altar of Repose and pray quietly before the Blessed Sacrament and then leave when

they are ready. The liturgy doesn't formally conclude; it simply pauses.

It picks up again on Good Friday with the Solemn Celebration of the Lord's Passion. You'll notice that this solemn liturgy doesn't have the areusual formal beginning we are used to: the entrance procession or greeting by the priest. Rather, the priest and ministers enter the sanctuary when they are ready and, after prostrating before the altar, they simply pick up where they left off the evening before. Like

Holy Thursday, the Good Friday liturgy doesn't have a formal dismissal. Rather, the priest says a prayer over the people before departing. This is another pause.

The Easter Vigil begins outside around a fire with no opening song or procession. We resume our prayer from where we left off the day before. And it is only at the end of the Easter Vigil Mass that we hear the formal dismissal of the

assembly, "Mass is ended," with the double alleluia. The Easter Vigil, which always begins after sunset on Saturday, takes place on the third day of the Triduum, so the vigil is considered the Easter Mass. Subsequent Masses on Sunday are for those unable to attend the vigil.

I ask you to participate ardently in these services that Jesus has given us and which make us proud to be called Christians.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

On this Good Friday, Christians turn their attention especially to the Holy Land and its place in salvation history.



Christians in the Holy Land face special challenges – many of which we hear about in the news quite often. The pandemic had hit Christians in the Holy Land particularly hard. Most of them depend on pilgrimages for work. In addition, the tragic events that started on October 7, 2023, have brought many disastrous consequences, including a greatly increased need for support for the Christian community. Although often through adversities, a Christian presence always remained in the Holy Land since the beginning of the Church. It is important that Christians continue to live, work, and pray in the Holy Land, where the Church started.

The Franciscans who serve there have been entrusted with care, presence, and service of the Holy Places. They house and feed the poor, provide formation and education, and conduct pastoral ministry in 23 parishes and 80 shrines. This Good Friday collection is the primary means of support for their work.

Through the Good Friday Collection, you join with Catholics around the world to stand in solidarity with the Church in the Holy Land. Pope Francis encourages us to donate to this Pontifical Good Friday Collection as a means of peace and an assurance of a Christian presence in the place where Christ lived on earth. Please consider a thoughtful contribution to this worthy cause.

10 Mass Rules of Etiquette for Mass (We will cover one each week.)

As Catholics, we joyfully welcome people of all faiths and backgrounds to attend our liturgy and participate in our worship, but there are a few guidelines that might be helpful for a visitor (or even a devout Catholic!) to be conscious of.

These guidelines are intended to help you show reverence and respect for the sacredness of the Catholic Mass.

2. *Put Your Cell Phone on Mute and Keep it Your Pocket* – You're in a church. This is more than a building. It is a sacred space set apart for the worship of God. Putting your phone on silent will help to avoid an embarrassing disruption during the quieter parts of the Mass. In today's world, it is difficult to not look at our phones for an hour, but out of respect and reverence, please try to refrain from texting or using the internet while you are present in the house of God.

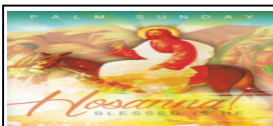

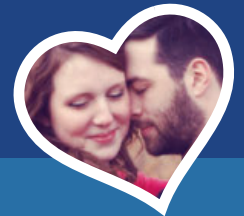
