From the Pastor in Solidum

In 1988, the Church published a very helpful and insightful letter which invites reflection on the Lent and Holy Week. The Circular Letter Concerning Preparation and Celebration of Easter Feasts contains some beautiful descriptions worthy of our prayerful reflection on these most important days of the year for Disciples of the Risen Lord.

During Holy Week, the Church celebrates the mysteries of salvation accomplished by Christ in the last days of his life on earth, beginning with his messianic entrance into Jerusalem.” The letter explains that “The lenten season lasts until the Thursday of this week. The Easter Triduum begins with the evening Mass of the Lord’s Supper, is continued through Good Friday with the celebration of the passion of the Lord and Holy Saturday, to reach its summit in the Easter Vigil, and concludes with Vespers of Easter Sunday.

Having begun this week with the celebration of Palm Sunday, we can keep our palms close by and continue to accompany Jesus, and our Elect who are preparing for the sacraments of Initiation at the Easter Vigil. The Chrism mass will be held at Blessed Sacrament Cathedral on Holy Thursday morning at 10:00 am. It is a beautiful celebration where priests from all over the Archdiocese gather with laity and the Archbishop to consecrate the oil of Catechumens, the oil of the Sick and Sacred Chrism. If you’ve never been, I’d encourage you go! But arrive early.

On Holy Thursday, our parishes will enter even more deeply into this week through the celebration of the Triduum, (The “three days”) culminating in the

Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday evening. I know that people who celebrate these days leave them with a renewed sense of joy and hope in the resurrection. I certainly do! The circular letter uses a beautiful image to describe this deeper relationship: “The Church, by the celebration of this mystery through liturgical signs and sacramentals, is united to Christ, her spouse, in intimate communion.” (38)

Good Friday has long been a day ‘set aside’ from business as usual as we accompany Christ in his passion and death, and in doing so, accompany all who suffer throughout the world, as Christ joins his suffering to theirs.

Finally, we gather around a fire on Saturday evening, which is blessed, along with the new paschal candle. Our candles are lit and provide enough light to scatter the darkness of the night at the Easter Vigil. Of this most holiest of nights, St. Augustine wrote:

“We keep vigil on that night because the Lord rose from the dead; that life . . . where there is no longer the sleep of death, began for us in his flesh; being thus risen, death will be no more nor have dominion. . . . If we have kept vigil for the risen one, he will see that we shall reign with him for ever.” St. Augustine, *Sermo Guelferbytan*, 5, 4, PLS 2: 552.

I’m looking forward to celebrating this most Holy of weeks with you. I ask for your prayers as we enter together into the mystery of Christ’s dying rising, along with our own.

Good Friday As a FAMILY

Just as we set aside time to spiritually prepare for Christmas Day, it makes sense to set aside time to prepare for the two most important days of the Christian year. Lent is a time that offers us an opportunity to come to terms with the human condition we may spend the rest of the year running from and it brings our need for a Savior to the forefront. Like Advent, Lent is a time to open the doors of our hearts a little wider and understand our Lord a little deeper, so that when Good Friday and eventually Easter comes, it is not just another day at church but an opportunity to receive the overflowing of graces God has to offer.

But unlike the childlike joy associated with the season of Advent, with its eager anticipation of the precious baby Jesus, Lent is an intensely penitential time as we examine our sinful natures and return to the God we have, through our own rebelliousness, hurt time and again. Lent is also an opportunity to contemplate what our Lord really did for us on the Cross - and it wasn't pretty. But ultimately, the purpose of Lent does not stop at sadness and despair - it points us to the hope of the Resurrection and the day when every tear will be dried.

Meditating on Christ's Sacrifice for Mankind: In addition to periodic fasting and prayer, our scriptural meditations

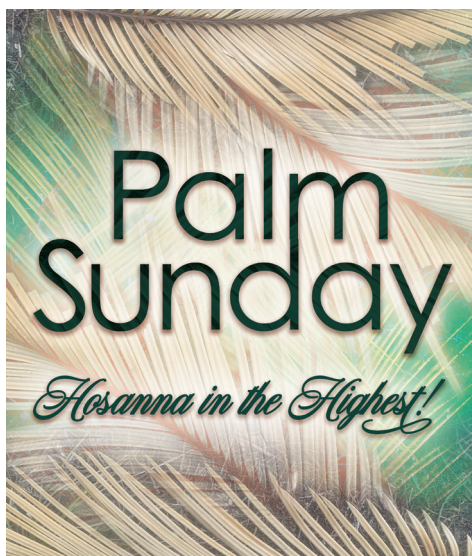
typically turn to the salvation offered to us through Christ's suffering. Read Old Testament Scriptures prophesying the suffering of Christ and the New Testament Gospel accounts.

The Riverview Knights of Columbus is encouraging everyone, especially as a FAMILY to recount what Lent is all about, The Love Jesus should by suffering and dying on the Cross for US.

What a better way to prepare for Easter than by daily meditation on his sufferings. Recount his passion by **ATTENDING AS A FAMILY** Venerating the Cross on Good Friday April 07 at 3:15 p.m. leading into the Glorious Resurrection of Easter and Mass on April 09.
