

When the early church first celebrated the resurrection at Easter, it did so without a Lent preceding it, or a season of Easter Sundays following. These times and seasons have developed over centuries to meet a very real human need: to allow the meaning of this greatest of feasts to 'unfold' or grow in our hearts so that they might truly have an impact in our lives.

So during these weeks, from time from Easter to Pentecost, our Easter Alleluia continues to grow stronger as it resonates in our hearts and we recognize the presence of the Risen Lord in the world around us, and we begin to see to see especially how death and resurrection of Jesus are completed by his ascension to heaven and the sending of the Holy Spirit to be the spirit, the life and the guide of the church on earth. Through

Spirit, Jesus is present in his church today. That Spirit is not a disembodied ghost! The Spirit lives and breathes in us: God's church.

For our neophytes, the new baptized, this post-Easter season is especially important. The newly baptized are now sharing in the eucharist. The tradition of mystagogy gives special emphasis to preaching the "mysteries" of the sacraments. The biblical readings of Year A which we hear this year (There are three Sunday cycles in the Lectionary: A, B & C) have been chosen especially for this purpose. "Mystagogical preaching" may be an unfamiliar notion, but it is my conviction that it can bring a new vitality to our worship and our life. Simply stated, the aim of preaching on the sacramental mysteries is "preaching that proclaims that these great truths are made visible and tangible to us in the sacraments." We preach and believe that the sights, sounds, tastes, smells and touches of the Easter Season which we celebrate

in the paschal candle, our Alleluia, with incense and bread and wine and joyful hearts and faces come together to provide us a very real encounter with the Risen Lord. Be like a sponge and allow these masses of the Easter Season to continue to fill you with joy thought the sensible signs that we use to praise God and bring joy to our hearts and salvation to our lives! Bring these signs home! You are encouraged to draw water from the Baptismal font and take it home. Sing Alleluia as part of your family meal prayer, and bless each other by signing each other on the sign of the cross with the baptismal water. When we bring home the words, songs, and gestures we share on Sunday, we return the following Sunday even more prepared to receive the grace God wants to share with us in the liturgy. Happy Easter. May Christ's Easter joy continue to fill your heart and enlighten your mind with his merciful love.



# Second Sunday of Easter: Divine Mercy Sunday

#### The Message Is Mercy

Sr. Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun who lived in Krakow, Poland, reported having visions of Jesus and conversations with him, which she wrote about in her diary, later published as the book The Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska, Divine Mercy in My Soul. Sr. Faustina's diary records fourteen occasions when Jesus requested that a Feast of Mercy be observed, for example:

My daughter, tell the whole world about my inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of my tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the font of my mercy. The soul that would go to confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment...Let no soul fear to draw near to me...It is my desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not have peace until it turns to the font of my mercy. (Diary, no.699)

On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina by Pope John Paul II, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday. The Paschal Mystery of the suffering, death, and resurrection reveals God's love. This particular Sunday is meant to be one of "thanksgiving for the goodness of God shown to people in the whole Easter mystery." (Pope John Paul II)

#### Plenary Indulgence for Divine Mercy Sunday

In a degree dated August 3, 2002, the Apostolic Penitentiary announced that in order "to insure that the faithful would observe this day (Divine Mercy Sunday) with intense devotion, the Supreme Pontiff himself established that this Sunday be enriched by a plenary indulgence...so that the people might receive a great abundance of the gift of consolation of the Holy Spirit."

The soul that goes to Sacramental Confession (which may take place some days before) and receives Holy Eucharistic Communion, reciting a prayer the Holy Father, adding a devote prayer like Merciful Jesus, I trust in you, on that day shall obtain the total forgiveness of all sins and punishment (like a second baptism). (The full text of the decree may be found at: www.mercysunday.com)

The readings and prayers for Mass on this day reflect perfectly on Our Lord's Divine Mercy. The Gospel of the Second Sunday of Easter narrates the wonderful things that the Lord accomplished on the Day of resurrection, during his first public appearance. Jesus said to them, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." (John 20:19-23) Sr. Helen Therese, OSF


