

#### EASTER IS A SEASON OF EXTRAORDINARY JOY!

The church has always experienced time as a sacrament! From the rising of the sun to its setting, we experience God's providential presence with us. As we pray together throughout the year, we celebrate and immerse ourselves more deeply in the ways God loves us and saves us from death forever. We celebrate the birth of our Savior at

Christmas; we prepare to celebrate his resurrection from the dead at Easter and throughout the year; we rejoice in the gospel accounts of his teaching, healing and table fellowship with sinners, including you and I!

When the church turned its attention to the liturgical year at the Second Vatican Council, it was decided that "the paschal mystery be contained

within the symbolic period of 50 days" (General Norms for the Liturgical Year and the Calendar 22-26 and 45-46). The Sundays of Easter are a privileged time for us to celebrate with great joy and more festivity: with baptismal water, and incense, with white vestments and song, especially the Alleluia! During the Easter season, we open up the Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel of John at Sundays and weekday masses. This year, (Cycle A in the Sunday Lectionary) the second reading on Sunday is taken from the First Letter of St. Peter, which preaches eloquently of the Easter mystery through passages which refer explicitly to the death and resurrection of Christ. The Easter season builds to the Ascension of the Lord, and finally, culminates in the celebration of Pentecost. We then begin Ordinary Time with two great feasts that celebrate God's very real presence in our lives: Trinity Sunday and the Feast.

The Easter readings, songs, stories and symbols are at the core of our faith. Allow Easter to continue to unfold in your own heart. Try these simple actions which can help lead you and your family into a prayerful celebration of the Easter Season:

- 1. Place the Bible in your home on the dining room table next a beautiful container which contains water you have drawn joyfully from the baptismal font at your parish.
- 2. Bake bread and invite neighbors over to talk about the Sunday readings for the weekends to come, or visit the homebound with the gift of bread and Easter Faith. These same homebound might deeply

appreciate the gift of the risen Lord from your hands as your bring them the Eucharist from Sunday mass!

- 3. Reading and recalling Jesus' gift of peace to his disciples after the resurrection ( John 20: 19-31) reconcile with the Lord in the Sacrament of Reconciliation and in your home and in your workplace.
- 4. Use this beautiful prayer of Leo the Great before or after your family meal:

He made us to pass:

From slavery to freedom

From sadness to joy,

From mourning to the feast,

From darkness to the light,

From slavery to redemption.

Therefore we say before him: Alleluia!

- Leo the Great, Sermon 44 on Lent 1

Easter is the most important part of the year. Lent is simply a preparation for this season. After the Fish Fries and the Stations of the Cross, let us embrace the joy of this most important season so that its Easter joy may permeate our hearts causing us to share it with others.

# A Journey of Faith/ Becoming a Catholic Christian

Jesus invited his followers to "Come, follow Me." So the image to describe the Christian disciple is a journey. For each of us, faith is a journey marked with moments of conversion along the way. Sometimes we move from questioning the faith to a deeper belief, from sin to repentance, from painful isolation to a joyful experience of a loving community, from fear to love. Faith, conversion, repentance, celebration and community---these are the five basic elements found in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the process that the Catholic Church uses to welcome people into the Catholic Church.

The RCIA process provides a setting where the journey of faith and moments of conversion are celebrated within the parish community.

The invitation is extended to:

- -Anyone who has never been baptized.
- -Anyone who has been baptized in another Christian denomination and wishes to know more about the Catholic faith.
- -Any Catholic who has not received the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist and/or Sacrament of Confirmation
- -Any non-active Catholic who has been away from the practice of the faith and would like to get reacquainted with Catholic teachings.
- -Any adult Catholic who would like to know more about the essential teachings about the faith.

If you know a family member, friend or coworker who has not been baptized or baptized in another faith and has a desire to learn more about the Catholic faith and the Gospel of Jesus, tell them that they are invited to inquire about the Catholic faith. # St. Joseph School

We can't believe it's the fourth quarter already. The 5th graders will be 6th graders before you know it! So far this quarter they have been working hard learning about properties of matter, our U. S. Constitution, and making good choices like the saints did.
