What is ministry? Where does it come from? As a church, we have a circuitous history, beginning with a clear vision of leaders in the community who were identified by the community with the help of the Holy Spirit to meet the needs of the community, especially the poor. This is what is described in the first reading today from the Acts of the Apostles. (Acts 6: 107) "The path of ministry from that day to today has been complicated by the human

tendency to seek privilege and power, instead of seeking to minister... after the example of Christ, and at his command." (*Eucharist Prayer for use in Masses for Various Needs IV*). This account of the call of Stephen and his companions can be a rich source of reflection for all of us on the service we owe one another as followers of Jesus.

1. Does our service of others arise out of their needs, so that we place our own needs after theirs? We need to care for ourselves while we care for others. I think of caretakers in homes and health care facilities who give so selflessly. They are a counter cultural witness to working toward a balance between meeting our own needs so that we can help others.

2. Are we using the gifts (charisms: talents and abilities inspired by the Holy Spirit) for the building up of the life of the community, and not just for our own profit? Do we recognize that the gifts of the Spirit have been poured out upon everyone? What are the gifts and talents I have been given to share? How can I help others to see theirs and share their gifts as well? As we witnessed the outpouring of the Holy Spirit

upon our young people who were confirmed at the 5PM Mass on April 16, it occurred to me that once the gifts of the Spirit are poured upon these young people, the impact must be felt on everyone in their family! When we allow the spirit to work through our lives and the lives of others, people see and know Christ, and the love of the Father he came to share. (Acts 6:7)

I myself, along with other Ministers, are imperfect vessels of God's generous grace, along with all of us. Look at St. Peter and the apostles, yet in the Acts of the Apostles, we learn that, through the Holy Spirit, God fills up in us what we are lacking and sends us to heal the world and to build up Christ's risen Body: the Church.

Go Make of All Disciples

From the Director of Discipleship Formation

What are you troubled about?

This Sunday's Gospel (John 14:1-12) is one that is often proclaimed at funerals. It is a beautiful message of hope that Jesus is going to prepare a place for us in heaven. Oddly enough, this passage is part of the Last Supper Discourses, and now proclaimed in the Easter Season. This Gospel follows Jesus' announcement to the disciples that he was going to be going away. Jesus then reassures his disciples: Do not let your hearts be troubled. Instead of being troubled, Jesus encouraged his disciples, just as he encourages us today: have faith, trust in God. He continues to reassure his disciples (and us) that he will come back again and take us to himself. This is the good news of our salvation: through his death and resurrection, Jesus promises to take us to be with the Father in heavenly glory. Similarly, St. Paul writes (1 Thessalonians 4:13), that we do not "grieve like the rest who have no hope," but rather have faith in God and in what Jesus promises."

This Gospel concludes with the statement from Jesus: "If you ask anything of me in my name, I will do it." Whatever we may be troubled about in life, Jesus is the answer. Our faith and hope in the resurrection, in all that Jesus promises to those who believe, is the antidote to any suffering or troubles in this life. Asking things of Jesus in prayer need to be offered in obedience to God's will for our lives. Our prayer must resemble the petition of the Our Father: "Your will be done, on earth as in heaven." So, take challenges, troubles, joys - all of our life experience, in prayer to the Lord. Allow him to enter into these situations. At the end of your prayer, proclaim Jesus' words as often as you need: "Do not let your hearts be troubled. You have faith in God; have faith also in me."

A Journey of Faith/ Becoming a Catholic Christian

Jesus invited his followers to "Come, follow Me." So the image to describe the Christian disciple is a journey. For each of us, faith is a journey marked with moments of conversion along the way. Sometimes we move from questioning the faith to a deeper belief, from sin to repentance, from painful isolation to a joyful experience of a loving community, from fear to love. Faith, conversion, repentance, celebration and community--- these are the five basic elements found in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. This is the process that the Catholic Church uses to welcome people into the Catholic Church.

The RCIA process provides a setting where the journey of faith and moments of conversion are celebrated within the parish community.

The invitation is extended to:

- Anyone who has never been baptized.
- Anyone who has been baptized in another Christian denomination and wishes to know more about the Catholic faith.
- Any Catholic who has not received the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist and/or Sacrament of Confirmation
- Any non-active Catholic who has been away from the practice of the faith and would like to get reacquainted with Catholic teachings.
- Any adult Catholic who would like to know more about the essential teachings about the faith.

If you know a family member, friend or coworker who has not been baptized or baptized in another faith and has a desire to learn more about the Catholic faith and the Gospel of Jesus, tell them that they are invited to inquire about the Catholic faith.
