We have been listening to the Acts of the Apostles as the first reading throughout the Season of Easter. The beginning of the Acts of the Apostles outlines the mission the Risen Jesus gave to the early church: "You shall be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all of Judea and Samara and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8) The first readings from Acts this week reports on the impact of this apostolic mission in Samaria: "The rejoicing in this town rose

to a fever pitch". (Acts 8:8). This is a result of the preaching and ministry of Phillip, who was the successor to St. Stephen, the first martyr.

The power of the resurrection continued to spread in the early church through the preaching of the Apostles. Peter and John took notice and joined Phillip in Samaria! In a gesture that recalls our confirmation, they imposed hands on them, and

they received the Holy Spirit. Jesus speaks about this promise of his presence which we receive through the Holy Spirit in today's gospel for the Sixth Sunday of Easter, as he reassures us that we have received the "Spirit of truth" whom we can recognize because he remains with us and within us.

Jesus acknowledges what we already know: the world does not always pay attention to the movement of the Spirit in and among us. Violence and war, materialism and division are not signs that the Spirit of God is working in us and among us. At the same time, there is a great reassurance from the Lord. "I will not leave you orphans"! Jesus know we would feel abandoned in this world from time to time. He is still with us. Not only that, he says, "I will come back to you." And "On that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you." The great Catholic American biblical scholar Raymond E. Brown wrote that "Just as Jesus received everything from the Father and while on the path is the way to know the Father in heaven, so when Jesus goes to heaven, the Paraclete who receives everything from Jesus is the way to know Jesus. "

Our job in the interim, is to pay attention to the call in Acts 1:8: to be his witnesses. We have been baptized in that same Spirit and endowed with charisms in Confirmation precisely for this mission. The seriousness of this mission is pointed out in the final sentences of today's gospel. (John 14: 15-21) wherein we are told that sharing in Jesus mission is the sign of our love for Him, we are not orphans. We are loved by the Father, who sends us his Son and the Holy Spirit, so that we can share completely in his life by being 'on mission!'

This week: Share your faith on Social Media: Post a favorite prayer, or a photo of yourself or a loved one receiving first Eucharist or another sacrament. Share your thoughts and hopes in that moment. Post pictures of baptisms, weddings, confirmations, or other days when the Holy Spirit was poured out upon us, anointing us for our mission!

May, the Month of Mary

The entire month of May falls within the liturgical season of Easter, which is represented by the liturgical color white — the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity and innocence (absolute or restored).



A Time of Grace

The world is resplendent with Spring's increased light and new growth. It is Mary's month in the Easter season and all of nature rejoices with the Queen of heaven at the Resurrection of the Son she was worthy to bear. During the remainder of Easter time, let us endeavor through the prayers of the Holy Liturgy and the Holy Rosary to deepen our gratitude for the mystery of our Baptismal rebirth in Christ.

"The month of May, with its profusion of blooms was adopted by the Church in the eighteenth century as a celebration of the flowering of Mary's maidenly spirituality..With its origins in Isaiah's prophecy of the Virgin birth of the Messiah under the figure of the Blossoming Rod or Root of Jesse, the flower symbolism of Mary was extended by the Church Fathers, and in the liturgy, by applying to her the flower figures of the Sapiential Books- Canticles, Wisdom, Proverbs and Sirach.

"In the medieval period, the rose was adopted as the flower symbol of the Virgin Birth, as expressed in Dante's phrase, 'The Rose wherein the Divine Word was made flesh,' and depicted in the central rose windows of the great gothic cathedrals-from which came the Christmas carol, 'Lo, How a Rose 'ere Blooming.' Also, in the medieval period, when monasteries were the centers of horticultural and agricultural knowledge, and with the spread of the Fransiscan love of nature, the actual flowers themselves, of the fields, waysides and gardens, came to be seen as symbols of Mary..." — John S. Stokes

Pentecost, the birth of the Church, is also among the celebrations of May. Though sprung from the side of Christ on the Cross, the Church marks as her birthday the descent of the Holy Spirit on Mary and the Apostles. At the 'birth' of the world, the Holy Spirit — the Breath of God — was the "mighty wind [that] swept over the waters" (Gen 1:2); at the birth of the Church He is present again "like the rush of a mighty wind" to recreate the world in the image of Christ through His Church (Acts 2:2).

We, the members of Christ's Mystical Body, are the present-day disciples sent by the Holy Spirit to bring Christ to the world. May we go forth as did Mary, who set out in haste to assist St. Elizabeth (feast of the Visitation, May 31). Come upon us, O Holy Spirit, so that, with Mary, we may proclaim the greatness of the Lord who has done great things for us — for his mercy endures forever!
