20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
AUGUST 20, 2023

Did you see the clip of Pope Francis' homily at World Youth Day in Lisbon, Portugal? Ever since he was the Archbishop of Buenos Aires, he has enjoyed employing the technique of asking members' assembly to repeat a word or a phrase to bring his point home. This time, as he was preaching before one of the largest crowds ever for World Youth Day, he asked the crowd to repeat "Todos! Todos! Todos!" He was referring to the church's open doors, and the fact that the church exists to bring salvation to everyone, to all! ("Todos"). This has been a theme since the beginning of Pope Francis's pontificate. It has always been a theme for Jorge Berglio, and the gospel today seems to reinforce this theme.

Sometimes, we are all too quick to quickly size up people by inaccurate and racist stereotypes, at the expense of the dignity of the individual.

Our attitude is not like God's. We ask: Who's in and who's out? Are you a member? Do you have an ID? Show me your green cards! So many of our interactions require us to show that we belong, that we're "in." Often we use the badges of dress, jewelry, addresses, automobile, degree, title and other possessions to prove our right to belong.

When we do this, we step over a treasure. We blind ourselves to an incredible beauty and we miss a great opportunity. We are worthwhile. We have dignity because we are created in the image and likeness of God. We are God's beloved ones. But since we are so beloved by God (if indeed we are God's work of art, as St. Paul says) then every other person in the world is no less God's beloved son or daughter and deserving of the same profound respect we are. "Todos!"

Continued... The Canaanite woman knew her worth and her daughter's worth even though she was a foreigner, and a woman alone in a man's world, who believed that Jesus ought to help her. She was committed to believe in Jesus even though she didn't have the right credentials. Even though he rejected her. Even though the apostles were irritated by her and tried to get rid of her. Her strength and perseverance came from a sense of her worth, not from accidental factors such as race, nationality, or gender. Her energy and courage came from her love for her child. How many of us have stormed heaven asking God to cure a sick child, or friend, or parent. In praying this way, the Canaanite mother, and we ourselves, call Jesus to be truly who he was — redeemer of the world, not just of Israel.

The Canaanite woman is an example for all of us, who hesitate to approach God in prayer, asking for what we need. Often we fear that we are unworthy, or that we should not be asking anything for ourselves, or that God will be angry with our feelings or desires. Perhaps we worry that God does not want to bother with us now or that we are “foreigners” to the house of the Lord. The Canaanite woman may have been

frightened to approach this Son of David, but love for her daughter gave her courage to cry out to Jesus for pity and then to continue convincing him even when his first answer seemed to be no. See yourself as included in the “Todos.” Once we know we belong, including others as our Heavenly Father does comes more easily!

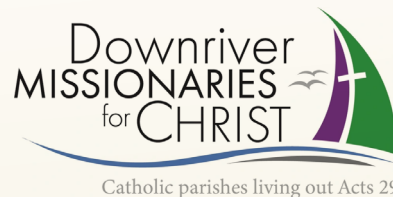

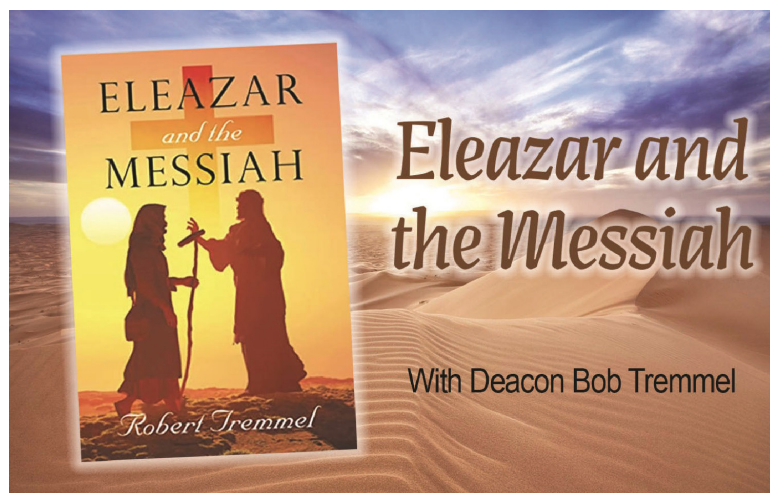
