oor St. Peter. He sinks in the storm, after stepping out in faith, and he denies Jesus after Jesus predicted he would do so in His passion. But today, Peter gets it right! He proclaims the divinity of Jesus, the Son of the Living God. He earns a gold star and points us to the Lord in the process. Next Sunday, poor St. Peter will stumble and be corrected by the Lord again!

The episode in today's gospel occurs in a place that reeks with importance. If you've ever driven or ridden around Washington DC with its plethora of marble columns and monuments, you might get an idea about the kind of place that Caesarea Phillipi was.

At the very site of the ancient shrine to the Greek god Pan, in the city given to Herod by Caesar Augustus and by Herod to his son, Philip, Jesus gives to his followers (through Peter, in this text) the power to unlock evil. No longer is Caesar or Herod proclaimed as the one power in the world, but Jesus is confessed as the Messiah, ruling over eternity. *Continued on p. 2*

Continued... Through all of these readings, there is a thread of contrast between the temporal and eternal, that which is forceful merely on earth and that which has sway forever. That thread is knotted here in the Gospel.

How shall we understand the Rock? The keys to the kingdom were also handed by Jesus to the whole church in Matthew 18:18. Which is it? The readings for today seem to insist that the power to do justice lies both in Peter, as first confessor, and in the church. The ministry of Peter and his successors, including Pope Francis (who is now among the oldest man to serve as Pope) is primarily of preserving unity through mercy. The work of reconciliation belongs to the whole church. Peter is the first among many reconcilers, including you and me. What an awesome responsibility! Yet, we are certainly up to the task because the Holy Spirit has been poured upon us to enable in us and through us, the works of mercy. God will never forsake the works of His hands!


