SEPTEMBER 24, 2023

In El Paso Texas, immigrants who have recently crossed the border, often from South America, are looking for work. This is why immigrants have come: to find work and a better life for their families. When a truck pulls up, the individuals who can climb up onto the truck first are the ones who receive the hours and the pay. The reality we continue to witness in many places in our country and round the world of migrants making sacrifices for their families repeats itself. The surplus of workers is even reflected in today's parable from Matthew's gospel.

From our contemporary context, this parable brings to mind issues of immigration and daily laborers. What is "fair" for those who work among us as migrant workers or labor in the various service industries supporting Western financial institutions, the highly educated professional class and our technologically driven economic complex? And, what

is to us if the minimum wage rises to assist those workers on the lowest end of our economic system? Some people wonder if there is enough to go around.

We learn about the meaning of parables, and the entire preaching of Jesus, when we consider it in the light of the larger context of the gospel in which it is found. In this case, the "parable of the laborers in the vineyard" is unique to Matthew. The stories Matthew uses to surround this parable -- the rich young man, Peter's claim to have "left everything" and Jesus' third prediction of his death, James & John's request -- were consecutive stories in Mark. Matthew's inclusion of this parable interrupts that narrative flow. In Matthew's narrative context, Jesus' parable seems to be a story directly (connected) to discipleship issues, possessions, and authority. So, despite the circumstances we witness in the world around us, and the images and characters... *Continued on p. 2*

Continued... in parable we hear in Matthew's gospel, the parable is really not about the "laborers in the vineyard." In fact, this is not even a story about the growth of the vineyard. Nor was there any significant attention on the activities of the workers. We hear the complaints of those who have toiled all day long, but the story was really not about them either.

Rather, the point of Jesus' parable arrives at its 'punchline' which is the question of the vineyard owner at the end of the parable. highlights the generosity of God. As the ultimate "landowner," God will use what has always belonged to the Creator for the good of all even if humans fail to view the world through God's eyes. In Jesus earlier words: God's perfection is exemplified in God's rain on the just and the unjust (cf. 5:48). The landowner's question in the parable is Jesus' punchline for the story: "Are you envious because I am generous?" This is a poignant question in the world we live in today, where we are often afraid to share God's blessings, because we have learned to look out only for our own interests first. This tendency manifests itself in the economic, political, ecclesial, and even in our personal relationships. Are we jealous of God's love? We know that jealousy arises when we compare ourselves to others and are afraid of coming up short in the comparison. That can never

happen when God's eyes gaze upon us. The love of God's heart is inclusive and infinite. When you find yourself looking over your shoulder at another group, person, who might be 'catching up' or even overtaking you, do not choose fear. Remember we need not be jealous of the love of God poured out for all. Instead, we walk along with everyone who is created and loved by the Father, and journey with them on the way home to the Kingdom.

Our stewardship, including our financial support of our parish communities is our response to God's many blessings in our life, and a vital way we become disciples. St. Cyprian will be conducting an Offertory Enhancement Campaign this fall to strengthen the weekly collections of the parish. We rely on our Offertory donations to pay for the day-to-day operations of the parish including utilities, supplies, youth and adult religious programs, staffing, and maintenance and repairs to our parish buildings and grounds. Protecting God's Children Recertification

All parish employees and parish volunteers who completed Protecting God's Children (PGC) before January 1, 2020, must be recertified by **November 1, 2023**. The goal is to protect, especially children and vulnerable adults from sexual abuse. The training can be done online and should take about 2.5 hours to complete.

Participants are taught to identify situations that could leave a child vulnerable, the signs that a child may have experienced abuse, the methods of sexual offenders and critical steps to help prevent abuse.

Who is required to attend the Protecting God's Children workshops?

- All clergy working in the Archdiocese of Detroit
- All adult paid employees of Central Services, Parishes, and Catholic Schools
- All adult volunteers
