28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME OCTOBER 15, 2023

When couples marry, the joy of the day includes what is commonly referred to as the "wedding reception": a joyous celebration of music, food and dancing. Growing up in a Polish family, I have many great memories of such celebrations with my family. In the past several years, I have taken to referring to these celebrations not as receptions, but as banquets, because of the centrality of the image of banquets in the gospels, where banquets are joyous promises of the reign of God which we long for.

In the first reading today, Isaiah describes a celebration that promises the enjoyment of the goods of creation ("rich food and choice wines"), healing, and consolation ("the Lord God will wipe away the tears from every face"). This reading is sometimes proclaimed at Funerals, in addition to the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time [A] we are celebrating today. The banquet feast evokes a community gathered in grateful response to an entirely unmerited invitation.

The wedding banquet offered in the Gospel is also tinged with foreboding. The excessive violence

enacted on those who reject or disrespect the invitation reminds me of the sudden violence which plunged the Middle East into another war last week. It may also be a reflection of the fact that Jerusalem had fallen in a Jewish uprising against the Roman occupiers which occurred after the Resurrection of Christ, when this gospel was written down. When we read of such violence in the Scripture, it is often a reflection of our human response rather than the will of a vengeful God. God is mercy.

Wedding feasts appear frequently in Jesus' teaching. In Matthew's version of this parable we are invited to hold together two realities. First, the promise of the coming reign of God, a coming already begun in Jesus, is directed to us all—it is an invitation that we have not earned by our social status or good behavior. Second, though we cannot earn an invitation, we must respond to it with grateful hearts, willing to give ourselves over to the peculiar etiquette of the banquet feast. We must come wearing the appropriate "wedding garment," a heart open to conversion. This is the white garment we received in baptism. ... *Continued on p. 2*

This banquet feast is populated by the communion of Saints. We invite you to continue to bring photos of the faithful departed and place them around the altar during the months of October and November. We recall their example of faith and love while we look forward to joining them around the table of the Lord in Heaven.

I'll be on retreat until late afternoon on Friday of this week. Please keep me in your prayers. I will be praying for all of you.


# World Mission Sunday

# Go Make of All Disciples

"Many are invited, but few are chosen" ...or respond?

The concluding words of this weekend's Gospel (Matthew 22:1-14) say, "Many are invited, but few are chosen." What came to my mind as I was reading this passage, is that there are many ministries and functions in our parish. Many are invited, but few respond. There are a couple reasons in my mind that are why people do not respond: I'm not worthy... Someone else will do it better...

Each of us have gifts and charisms that God has given particularly to be used by us. If we do not use them, the Body of Christ does not receive the benefit of gifts being shared with one another. Our first reading this weekend (Isaiah 25:6-10a) reminds us that the Lord of hosts will provide for all peoples. I have no doubt that we will be able to live with abundance, as St. Paul reminds us in our second reading (Philippians 4:12-14, 19-20). As we are invited or if we are encouraged or inspired to offer our gifts, let us lean on Christ and say, "I can do all things in him who strengthens me."

The life of a disciple is one which is obedient to what God is calling that disciple to do. To grow daily as a disciple is to pray daily, receive the Sacraments, engage in Christian service, and just be joyful. Let people around you know there's something different about you...you must be a follower of Jesus!



The Fourth Graders have been working with numbers and place value in the millions and just started a chapter on multiplication concepts in Math.


