Be Prepared...

The Gospel reading for today depicts two groups: those who are prepared for the coming of the Lord, and those who are not. The time when the bridegroom comes will be a time for rejoicing only unto those who have been vigilant in awaiting his coming. The other readings examine the question of our preparedness in other ways.

The first reading and the responsorial psalm both include mention of a nighttime vigil and awaiting the one long hoped for. The verb used for "seek" in the psalm, may be derived from the Hebrew word for "dawn". Since the days of the

early church, the rising of the Sun in the East has been a reminder of the Risen Jesus, who will return to bring redemption for all people. The one who anticipates the dawn is seeking Jesus, who is in his own person the wisdom of God (1Cor1: 24, cf. 1:30) will not grow weary, but like the wise maidens of the parable, will rejoice at the coming of the bridegroom. In general, it can be said that the wise and foolish ones represent positive and negative models for awaiting the coming of the Son of man.

... Continued. Wisdom involves preparedness through a life lived in prayer alone with others. The wise person dedicates time and energy to charity, beyond the comfortable circle of family and friends. The wise one points others to the rising Sun: the Risen Lord present in our midst through the Church, imperfect as it is.

The church's baptismal liturgy with its presentation of the lighted candle, prays that the newly baptized may keep the flame of faith alive in the heart and finally, as Paul wrote to the Thessalonian Christians go out with all the saints in the heavenly kingdom to meet the Lord when he comes. These readings are a challenge to me to 'wise up!' by lifting my own eyes and heart in expectant hope for the coming of the Savior. In my better moments, this hope fills me with joy, not trepidation, though if we are honest, we most probably experience both when we think about the Lord's return.

Lift up your eyes and hearts this week beyond the war, the division, the stubbornness of your own heart and mine. Together let us point out to others the source of our hope and joy, Jesus who comes to save us, and be prepared to greet him with our lamps full of the oil of rejoicing when He comes.

Have you heard of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini?

In the late 1800s, Frances Xavier Cabrini, who founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart, came to the United States. Her mission was to establish schools, hospitals and orphanages. We thank God for the many people like Frances as we continue to benefit from her ministry. We are blessed to have two Catholic Schools in our Family of Parishes: St. Joseph Parish School and Gabriel Richard High School. Beaumont Trenton Hospital is also in our Family of Parishes. These great institutions have served generations of people and continue to do so. The Catholic Church has contributed to educating, healing, and protecting people at various stages of life, from early education, to hospital stays and beyond thanks to people like St. Frances Xavier Cabrini.

As we celebrate her feast day on November 13, let us ask her intercession for all those who are currently in our schools and hospitals:

God our Father, you called Frances Xavier Cabrini from Italy to serve the immigrants of America. By her example teach us concern for the stranger, the sick and the frustrated. By her prayers helps us to see Christ in all the women and men we meet. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.


