We can't follow the same old ways once we have seen ourselves and the world by God's light. Once we have been enlightened by the light of Christ, we can't continue to accept violence, coercion, lies or manipulation. 
... Continued We look at the days and months in front of us and wonder about how we will fare; When will peace rule peoples' hearts? Will our lives return to normal this year? Will we learn to listen to one another and stop arguing? I believe that the answer is "yes", at least we certainly can. We live with the hope that Isaiah and the Magi give us: God will not abandon us, but will shine light on our dark winter days. Will all things get better immediately? Hardly! But the Magi represent those of us following the God-provided light. It shines on the "insiders" and the "outsiders" -- a way has been illumined, a path has been shown us and we must continue to live by the light we have seen.

The Magi did not unload their camels, dismiss their porters and settle down in Bethlehem to continue their homage to the Christ child. They did homage to the child, quickly got up off their knees and then moved on. Maybe they went home to tell their families and friends about their journey and how the star guided them through the nights.

Today is January 7, 2024. Do you know what that means? It means that in five weeks we will be lining up on Ash Wednesday to receive Ashes together. It is truly beautiful to be the church, a people who celebrate the story of our salvation year after year. The story of Jesus birth and his death and resurrection is the light that has been placed into our hearts to share. Do you still have palms in your home? Start making crosses out of them. We'll attach them cards for you to hand to people during Lent to invite people to walk the journey of Lent and Easter with us. (I'm sure there are lots of YouTube videos with instructions on who to turn palms into crosses!)

As we leave church and the crib scene today we will begin a journey toward Ash Wednesday and the cross. We can make this journey with the confidence that no darkness we face can put out the light that burns within us. Hear Isaiah's promise, "Then you shall be radiant at what you see, your heart shall throb and overflow." Shall we resolve to continually turn toward the light we have seen, bow down to worship and then carry the light again into the world?

Let's kneel and do homage today to the eternal and holy One who comes to us in the form of a child, but then grows into adulthood to invite us to follow the One we call, the Light of the World.

Merry Christmas?

Yes! We're still celebrating the Christmas season! When I was walking through stores right after Christmas, there was already stuff out for Valentine's Day! Oddly enough, Valentine's Day is Ash Wednesday this year. That aside, I mention this because society is over Christmas just as we're starting! Since there isn't much about Jesus' childhood in Scripture, we cover some high points in this season, of course with Jesus' birth, and recognizing the Holy Family (last weekend). Today's very known story is of the 3 wise men following the star and giving gifts to Jesus. Do you know the significance of those gifts?

Gold - because Jesus is King!

Frankincense - because we use incense in worship and we worship only God!

Myrrh - as this was used in preparing a body to be buried and they knew he would die for us!

So when does the Christmas season end?

Oddly enough, this year, the Christmas season ends on a Monday. The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord is seen as the inauguration of Jesus' public ministry. Just as our own baptism is meant to give us gifts and charisms for service, Jesus needed to be baptized (of course differently than we were) to show the people he was set aside for a particular purpose. So, how do we celebrate this?

There are 3 opportunities for Mass in our Family of Parishes to mark this last day of the Christmas Season - Monday, January 8, 2024: 9 am at Our Lady of the Woods, 9 am at St. Roch, and 12 noon at Sacred Heart. If you're not accustomed to participating in daily Mass, make it a priority this day. Allow for this feast to also make you think of your own baptism and how God has set you apart for a purpose.

Presentations will be held on:


Tuesday mornings 10:00 am to Noon, starting January 30th.


