3RD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME JANUARY 21, 2024

he Third Sunday of Ordinary Time (January 21, 2024) has been singled out by Pope Francis as a day to celebrate the Word of God. The reality of God's revealing and saving Word is so much more than what is found on the pages of the Bible. The gospels were experiences of Jesus before they were reflections formed by the preaching of the Gospel by Matthew, Mark, Luke and John for their communities. The Word of God is not contained in ink printed on paper but in the human interaction between proclaimer and listener. This is one of the reasons the invitation at the end of the readings at mass no longer includes: "this is..." the Word of the Lord. We respond "Thanks be to God" not for the Words printed in the Lectionary, but for the force of God's Word: the two edged sword that has the power to pierce hearts and cause us to respond in action for reconciliation, peace and justice.

The Scripture proclaimed in the midst of God's spirit filled people, is sacrament because it is an encounter with Christ that occurs between believers. This is why we are encouraged not to "read along" with the readings, but to look and listen and be attentive to the one proclaiming God's word. *Continued on p. 2*

... Continued We revere the Book of the Gospels not only for the words printed in it, but more importantly for the challenge and consequences of its proclamation in our lives and in the world.

The Liturgy of the Word is no less an encounter with the presence of the Risen Lord than our sharing in his body and blood. This first part of the mass is a dialogue between the creator and the created, between redeemer and redeemed. We respond with periods of silence in between the readings, and by singing the Responsorial Psalm. We respond to the Gospel by standing and singing "Alleluia" and by unfolding its meaning in our lives today in preaching. The Universal Prayers are also a part of our response to the Word of God, as we begin to commit to take what we have received and live it. The Word is thus broken and shared like the Eucharist which follows its proclamation. "

What can you do to open up riches of the Scriptures in your own life?

- 1. The Gospels were written, along the writings of the prophets and the Pauline letters for public proclamation. Read the Sunday readings, out loud, even if you are alone. I find that I often hear and find things I would never have found reading in silence.
- 2. Buy a blank book and begin a journal, reflecting on the Sunday Word before you attend mass, including questions the Word raises in you. You can also include reflections that arise in you after Mass.
- 3. Consider sharing in the vital ministry of the Lector, who proclaims the readings at Mass. I know my faith was inspired by seeing my parents as liturgical ministers. What impact could this witness have on your children, or grandchildren, friends and neighbors?

In the inspired words of St. Paul: "Let the word of Christ richly dwell within you, with all wisdom teaching and admonishing one another with psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs, singing with thankfulness in your hearts to God." (Colossians 3:16)




