I am always grateful when a parishioner brings a sick or homebound neighbor or friend to Church. Sometimes they come seeking the anointing of the sick. Illness causes alienation from family, friends, parish and even our own bodies! The Church, meaning you and I, have the unique ability to bridge that gap and heal that alienation through our own care and concern.

"Illness can also lead to anguish, self absorption, ...even despair and revolt against God. It can also make a person more mature, helping him to discern in his life what is not essential so that he can turn toward that which is. Very often illness provokes a search for God and a return to him." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, # 1501) ... *Continued on p. 2*

... *Continued* We can help comfort and strengthen people when they are sick through the prayers and sacraments through the Pastoral Care of the Sick. This includes, praying with children and their parents when they are sick, communion to those in hospitals and the homebound, the anointing of the sick and viaticum: which is the sharing of the Eucharist with the dying.

"Last rites" are not the anointing of the sick. The anointing of the sick is not "last rites." What we used to refer to as last rites is holy communion. Last rites consist of prayers around the viaticum ("food for the journey") or the communion of the dying. Sometimes, medical care prevents this moment as people are sedated and unable to receive the Body of Christ. This does not diminish our ability to surround them with our prayerful presence. This also reminds us how important and beautiful it is to bring communion to the sick in hospitals and to the homebound.

In today's gospel (Mark 1: 29-39) people tell Jesus about the illness of Peter's mother-in-law as soon as he enters her home. We should call the priest for anointing of the sick whenever they are seriously ill. This can include a diagnosis of a serious illness, or treatment of the same. People who live with chronic conditions or addictions can also be anointed. It is also good to anoint people who are simply living with the effects of growing older. We offer the anointing of the sick during mass on the First Thursday of the month at 9:00 am at St. Cyprian, Riverview, and on the First Friday of the month at noon at Sacred Heart Parish, Grosse Ile.

When Jesus takes Peter's mother-in-law by the hand, he "raises her up." The "thoughts and prayers" we offer the sick and suffering are good, but we can frequently do so much more. We can help people through the trials of illness by accompanying them, cooking or shopping for them, and easing the loneliness of the sick and their caregivers simply by visiting them and praying with them. The Eucharist is a great source of healing we can all offer the homebound and the hospitalized. As Jesus says at the end of today's gospel: "For this purpose I have come." As Christ's risen body, the Church, we share in this healing mission for the sick in the world.

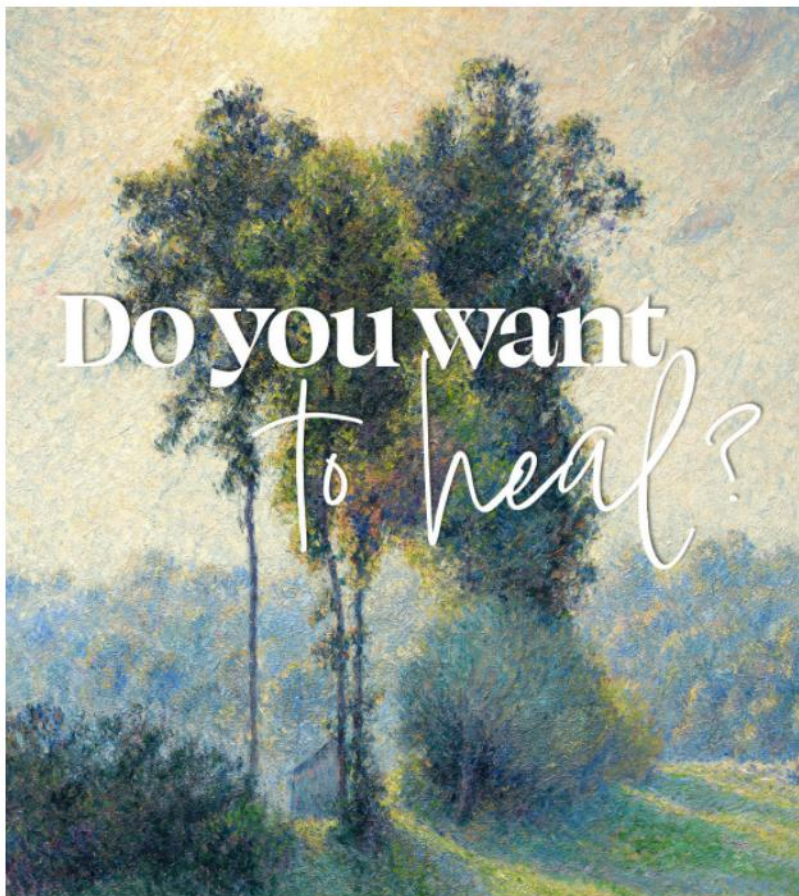


Rice Bowls

Lent is a liturgical season that focuses on the three spiritual pillars of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. This 40-day journey, beginning with Ash Wednesday and ending with Holy Week, is a time for sacrifice and spiritual reflection preparing us for the joyful celebration of Christ's resurrection on Easter Sunday.

One simple way to enhance your Lenten experience is to participate in the CRS Rice Bowl program. During Lent, Catholic families across the United States use a Rice Bowl—a small cardboard box—to collect alms.
