

Go Make of All Disciples

I Will Walk Before the Lord...

This phrase from Psalm 116 is part of our Responsorial Psalm this weekend. We are called to walk with the Lord no matter the cost. There's so much going on in our Scripture readings this weekend that show the challenges of walking before the Lord in our daily lives. The Old Testament Reading from Genesis recalls the sacrifice of Abraham, being instructed to take his son Isaac to be sacrificed. Of course, the end of the story is the Lord's messenger ended up telling Abraham not to sacrifice Isaac, knowing how faithful Abraham was to God. Then comes the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus. Mark's account (9:2-10) shows Jesus' most intimate circle of disciples, Peter, James and John, being led up a high mountain. Here, Jesus's humanity was radiating his majesty as the Son of God as His clothes become dazzling white. White clothing signifies the holiness that can come only from God.

No matter the path our life puts us on, God is calling us to two things here this weekend: faithfulness and holiness. To walk before the Lord is to walk in faithfulness. As Abraham, Peter, James, and John were faithful to the Lord in what He asked of them, so we must be faithful to God's command and call in our lives. God calls us to holiness. As I mentioned above, white clothing signifies the holiness that can only come from God. Where else do we see this in Church? In baptism, we receive a white garment, children wear white as they receive the Eucharist for the first time, brides wear white wedding dresses, deacons and priests are ordained with white vestments. White is a sign of purity and holiness. In this baptismal season of Lent, let us recall our own baptism, where we were given a white garment, as our parents and godparents heard the words:

"You have become a new creation and have clothed yourself in Christ. May this white garment be a sign to you of your Christian dignity. With your family and friends to help you by word and example, bring that dignity unstained into eternal life." (from the Rite of Baptism)



RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS (RCIA) 2024 Lent

At the beginning of Lent, the Church celebrates the Rite of Election and the Rite of Calling the Candidates to Continuing Conversion. Prior to this rite, the Church, through its delegates, must make a decision regarding the readiness of the catechumens/candidates to continue to the next stage of the RCIA process. They must, on their part, decide whether or not they want to go on and eventually receive the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Holy Eucharist. Readiness for the next step (from the Catechumenate Stage to the Purification and Enlightenment Stage) is indicated by signs of conversion of heart, sufficient acquaintance with Catholic teaching and deliberate intention of receiving the sacraments of the Church.


