The VINE S BRANCHES

4TH SUNDAY OF LENT MARCH 10, 2024

On the third, fourth and fifth Sundays of Lent, we celebrate the Scrutiny's with the Elect: those preparing for full Initiation into the Catholic Church through the sacraments of baptism, confirmation and the Eucharist.

The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults reminds us that the process of initiation takes place within the larger community of the faithful. After all it is into this risen body of Christ, that the Elect are being initiated into! The rite describes the community's role in the process of Christian Initiation. (RCIA 31). By offering prayer, support, and example for those who are seeking Christ, the community of the faithful becomes an active, engaged, and important part of the RCIA process.

The rites which mark the progress of the Catechumen are always celebrated in the context of that faith community.

Whenever the Rite of Acceptance, Parish Rite of Sending, the Rite of Dismissal, the Rite of Scrutiny, and the Sacraments of Christian Initiation are celebrated, the community is present and participates in the celebration through word, song, acclamation, and gesture.

Support and encouragement for those joining the church can come in the form of letter or card writing, phone calls, or simple kind words of support offered whenever a catechumen or candidate is present. The role of sponsor is also extremely important during this process and mirrors the support from the parish community.

Finally, the initiation process is training in the Christian way of life. The community perhaps has no more important involvement in the process of initiation than that of being an example of what it means to live this way of life. Catechumens and candidates are constantly observing the community to better understand what it means to live the Gospel in all aspects of life—worship, service to each other and to the wider world, work, prayer, and even leisure. The community of the faithful, therefore, has great responsibility to strive to live the Gospel, so as to provide an example for all to see and learn from.

Please plan on joining our Elect as they are welcomed to the Table of the Lord at the Easter Vigil, at 8:30 PM on Holy Saturday. The Triduum Schedule can be found on next week's Vine & Branches. Let us pray for one another as we prepare to celebrate our new risen life in Christ at Easter.

Some Reflections from our Lenten Mission

I am writing this late in the evening after the first night of our 4-night Mission. Mary Wilkerson led us through some great stories of faith and wonderful examples from her own life (with the other nights sharing the other theological virtues of hope and love). Our story of faith, which is shared by Mary through Fr. John Riccardo, can be summed up in four words: we are created, captured, and rescued - which requires a response. What can that response be? Mary shared four things we can do if we truly respond to God's invitation:

Give God your life.

Every single Sunday we worship the way God should be worshiped.

Go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation - our God knew we would need to hear that we're forgiven.

Talk to God.

There's a great surrender prayer that was shared as well, which I'll share at a later time. Giving our lives over to God is letting go of the stuff that pulls us away from God and allowing our lives to be lived solely as a disciple of Jesus. A huge part of living as a disciple is to come together with other disciples. That includes Mass every Sunday! To prepare for Mass, we are so blessed in our Family of Parishes to have many opportunities to go to Confession - Wednesday, Saturday, and Sunday. And, I bet if you asked a priest another time to go to Confession, they'd welcome you right in! Lastly, but certainly not least, we need to talk to God. Nobody can have a relationship with someone and never talk to them. Jaime and I would have never gotten married if we didn't get to know one another. The only way we got to know each other was through conversation and sharing. Relationships take work - so does our relationship with God!

I'm inspired and it was just the first of four nights of this Mission. Of course, by the time you read this, the whole Mission will be over. I pray that all those in attendance this past week were as inspired as I was and am hopeful after seeing a packed Church praying, worshiping, listening and responding to God's invitation!






St. Joseph Preschoolers


