What does it mean to be a witness to the resurrection? Peter offered his countrymen and women a means to redemption. They could repent, and because of the power of Jesus' resurrection, they could be redeemed. To be a witness to the resurrection is to be a witness to mercy. First of all, God's mercy for us ourselves, and subsequently for all!not others...but all! Proud to have witnessed the risen Jesus, Peter is also proud to call himself a witness of the resurrection before those who had yet to come to faith. His message of repentance is a hope filled stance, for all of its hearers, as they are offered a new beginning.

Also a witness to the redemptive power of the resurrection, is the author of the second reading from the Johannine epistles. Like an elder brother concerned for wayward siblings, he writes lovingly and longingly, reminding those who sin of the intercessory prayer of Jesus at the Father's right hand.

... Continued He asks readers, both then and now, to maintain their integrity, i.e., to prove the truth of their (our) knowing and loving God by keeping God's commandments. This is a more intimate and caring framing of Peter's bold proclamation in the First Reading.

In today's Lucan gospel, the disciples who witnessed the risen Jesus on the way to Emmaus recount their experience and, in that moment of witnessing and recounting, the Lord became present among them both real and risen once more on the First Day of the Week. His wounds bear testimony to the "real" physical suffering he endured, and now shares a meal of peace and cooked fish. Jesus also reaffirmed that his mission was now their mission. They, we, in his name and by God's grace, are to preach penance for the forgiveness of sins to all the nations beginning at Jerusalem. Moreover, that real and risen Christ charged his own: "You are witnesses of this!"

Like the disciples in today's Lesson, we find Jesus in our midst, saying "Peace be with you." We find Jesus is in our midst opening up our minds to the Scriptures. We find Jesus is in our midst commissioning us to witness the awesome Easter Event. We find Jesus is in our midst commissioning us to proclaim the astonishing Good News: He is Risen! We find Jesus is in our midst commissioning us to turn the world upsidedown by demonstrating, in our relationships with one another, the meaning of the Christian Ministry of loving service.

As the joy of the resurrection continues to resonate in our hearts, please keep in prayer the adults and young people in our parishes and everywhere who will be celebrating First Eucharist and Confirmation with their families. These joy filled moments are the result of our sharing in the Good News Peter proclaimed in the first reading. It is the good news we celebrate in baptism, by sharing in the Eucharist, and by being sealed with the Spirit in Confirmation. This joy is renewed in us at every mass, and when we celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation. It is made manifest in the vocations of married couples and priests, and it is renewed and strengthened in the Anointing of the Sick. Beyond these sacramental celebrations, it is experienced in the world whenever you and I allow it to penetrate our hearts so profoundly that it is shared with others.

As the world around us warms up and we spend time outside, please share joy with your neighbors. Allow your shouted greetings and waves across the driveway to become conversations on the lawn, and invitations to share a meal. This is how the joy we celebrate at Easter becomes real in our own lives and in the lives of others. Like any great gift, it is meant to be shared.

Go Make of All Disciples

Why are you troubled?

This was a question Jesus asked the disciples in today's Gospel (Luke 24:35-48). It is always amazing to me to think that literally days after Jesus' resurrection, we see the disciples troubled, terrified, startled. I always thought they should have felt a sense of joy, mission, complete comprehension about the mission Jesus entrusted them with. But, Jesus goes on to have to remind them of who He was by showing his hands and his feet. Similarly, last week, Jesus had to show Thomas his hands and side. He reminded them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled."

Jesus reminded the disciples once more that He was to suffer and rise from the dead, and that they are witnesses of these things. In the midst of the fear of the disciples, Jesus poured out peace into their hearts, opening their minds to understand the Scriptures. This is our job now - to experience Jesus' resurrection, recognizing all that has happened was for you and I, for our forgiveness of sins. When we are troubled or doubtful, let us remember we're in good company. Those closest to Jesus were troubled and doubted. Thomas said he wouldn't believe unless he could put his finger into Jesus' side. Asking questions, being doubtful at times, struggling with our faith - all of these things happen in each of our lives at one point or another.

Allow Jesus to touch your hands and your feet to walk in His ways. As those who prepare to be catechumens (those preparing for baptism) receive the sign of the cross, they receive the cross on every part of their body. The presider says: "Receive the sign of the cross on your hands, that Christ may be known in the work which you do...Receive the sign of the Cross on your feet, that you may walk in the way of Christ. May this Easter Season unfold for each of us the mission of us as individuals, in our parishes, in our family of parishes, and in the world.
