FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER APRIL 28, 2024

eople come and go in our lives. They leave behind a piece of themselves with every encounter. If we don't rush forward too quickly ourselves, we learn to appreciate the impact that others have had upon us. Jesus is more than a person in the past. His presence with us is real and abiding. The gospel for the Fifth Sunday of Easter (John 15: 1-8) is part of the last supper discourse, which points to the time when Jesus will no longer be physically present to his disciples. Before the discourse begins, Judas Iscariot takes his bread and leaves the gathering. Jesus' teachings about our unity with him are bracketed by the departure of Judas and his later return to betray Jesus. Jesus uses a familiar image for his Apostles, one made ever more poignant by Judas' despair. He says, "I am the true vine..." Life flows through a vine into its branches. The vineyard was a part of everyday life in the gospels, a frequent gospel image. The break between the early church and Judaism was an established fact by the time of John's Gospel. The church knew itself as God's new people by virtue of its unity with Jesus. This understanding is at least partially reflected in the use of the words "true vine."

... Continued The emphasis is less on the transition from an "old" Israel to a "new" one and more on the Christian community, its union with Jesus and how it is (or not) bearing fruit. Living a life characterized by keeping his commandments, love for one another and service is "bearing fruit." Those who do not remain in him and bear fruit are cut off by the Father, thrown aside; they wither and are burned in the fire. Is Jesus talking about Jews who reject him and his commandments or followers whose initial acceptance of him has not resulted in a true conversion? I think both. It seems likely that by the time of John's gospel there were already Christians whose commitment in baptism did not extend beyond the equivalent of "showing up on Sunday."

The image the vine with its branches and Paul's image of the body with many different members are two very organic images of our Christian unity. By virtue of our baptism in Christ's name, there is a unity that incorporates us all, as different from one another as we may otherwise be. Make an effort to preserve the unity we experience in the Eucharist between Christ and with others.

Our unity in Christ is strengthened when we pray and serve him in others. A parish is a place where we can encounter the support we need to do both. Our unity with others is nurtured by a profound respect for others, and for the life of Christ which flows through the vine into all the branches, no matter how different and distinct they may be. I receive great hope when I contemplate the Universal nature of salvation. I am reminded of how much more God loves us in a broad and inclusive way. The vine is not selective, its life flows naturally, so it is with our God, and our connection to each other in the Lord.




