ASCENSION OF THE LORD MAY 12, 2024

Blare or Trumpets for the Lord! When I was in High School, Ascension Thursday was associated with the Spring Prom! Because at that time (Class of 1979), this feast we now celebrate on Sunday was celebrated on a Thursday. Most of the dioceses in our country now celebrate this feast on Sunday, recognizing that it is an important part of the mystery of Easter that we celebrate on the way to Pentecost. Great feast that Easter is, one day (not even three days!) is insufficient to celebrate the fullness of the mystery of the resurrection. So, as Christians, we keep a fifty-day-long festival, punctuated by the Solemnity of the Ascension of our Lord — the 40th day of Easter. The feast of the Ascension, like a prism, helps us focus the wondrous colors of the Easter spectrum. The promise of Jesus to send the Holy Spirit inspired great faith and faithful vigilance on the part of Mary and the Apostles. "Christ's ascension is our glory and hope." "The joy of the resurrection and the ascension renews the whole world." "Where Christ has gone, we hope to follow." "Christ has passed beyond our sight, not to abandon us, but to be our hope." "Christ was taken up to heaven to claim for us a share in his divine life." These images from the Ascension liturgy give us a sense of the hope and joy that color this feast:

If we have been united with Christ through baptism in his death and resurrection, we are surely united with him in the transformation and redemption of his humanity. What we celebrate, however, is not only a past or future event. We are given glimpses of our glorious destiny even now. So, feet firmly planted on earth, the community gathers to rejoice in the life we share with the risen Lord. We know that the Risen Jesus never abandons us but is always present to us even while he is seated at the right hand of the Father.

We gather to celebrate Jesus' ascending on the 40th day after Easter Sunday. The timing of the celebration is a matter of convenience. Having the celebration allows us to isolate one aspect of the total Easter event - the continuation of the Christian community once the historical Jesus is absent! The immediate effect of Jesus' absence is a community that reels in fear, anxiety and bewilderment. The Christian community seems to have no power to act of its own initiative! It has no cause or claim for self-congratulation. It is powerless, and unable to generate any power for its own use! *Continued on p. 2*

We are in a similar position today. Economic powers seem to be the central fact of our recent history. There doesn't seem to be any alternative power or relief from the deadly dominance of the economic powers-that-be! On the other hand, fundamentalist extremes of religious piety have become so rigorous and so firmly entrenched, that for many of us the possibility of acceptance and wholeness, has become very remote!! In Acts, the timing for Jesus' ascending is after "forty days". The number of days as forty, symbolizes a period of revelation, rather than meaning to suggest that Jesus' ascending, actually happened on the fortieth day!

Jesus' dying and resurrection have created in us and for us an eternal 'new day!' As we acclaim the Savior, seated at the Father's right hand in glory, let us recall that his greatest glory manifests in our lives through our compassion and mercy, drawing all who seek him to the love of the Father.

Mass Schedule Changes at St. Roch Parish in Flat Rock

Why is there a change in the weekend mass schedule?

As many people are aware there are fewer priests available to serve our parishes. When a priest is reassigned or retires in our Archdiocese, there is no longer a guarantee he will be replaced. This leads in turn to changes in the mass schedule of parishes, as we seek to find ways to provide for the celebration

of the Eucharist in each parish with the priests that remain dedicated to ministry in our Family. Our Family of Parishes has been preparing for this reality as we anticipate the retirement of Fr. Ray Lewandowski on July 1, 2024.

How was this decision made?

Over the past several months, the priests in solidum: Fr. Ray Lewandowski, Fr. Greg Banazak, Fr. Bob Johnson and Fr. Marc Gawronski have been praying and reflecting on the best way to meet the needs for masses at St Roch, Flat Rock, Our Lady of the Woods, Woodhaven and St. Timothy Parish Trenton.

As a part of this process, parishioners at St. Roch and Our Lady of the Woods were surveyed, a video about our mass schedules was created and shared, priests met with our Auxiliary Bishop, and we sought additional clergy for help with the mass schedule from outside the Family of Parishes. The survey of parishioners helped us to understand that Sunday 10:00 mass was the optimum time for St. Roch Parish in Flat Rock.

What is the new Mass schedule?

St. Roch, Flat Rock will have two weekend masses:

Saturday 4 pm

Sunday at 10 am

St. Timothy, Trenton will continue to offer **Sunday morning** mass at 9:30 am.

The weekend mass schedule at Our Lady of the Woods remains unchanged.

This Mass schedule is made possible by the generous assistance of the Capuchin Friars who agreed to provide Mass and help at St. Roch in Flat Rock until the end of the year.

Sacred Heart, Grosse Ile, St. Cyprian, Riverview and St. Joseph, Trenton, have all reduced their number of Weekend liturgies in the past three years. There is no change to their mass schedule.

We share our parishioner's love for the celebration of Mass each Sunday, and we understand that changes in the mass schedule can cause distress. Please know we have taken this decision, and after much reflection, and that we believe this is the best solution. We will re-evaluate this change after six months. Until then, we ask for your prayers and support as we strive to manifest Christ's presence not only in our churches, but in the world.

Go Make of All Disciples

Let us thank God for the gift of the Holy Spirit!

Last Sunday at St. Joseph, half of our Confirmandi were confirmed by Bishop Monforton. The other group will be confirmed on Pentecost Sunday by Fr. Bob Johnson at Our Lady of the Woods. Why isn't a bishop celebrating Confirmation? After we scheduled this date with the bishop's office, Bishop Battersby was named Bishop of LaCrosse, Wisconsin. All of the bishops from Detroit are going out the weekend of May 19 for Bishop Battersby's installation.



Because of this, Fr. Bob Johnson was delegated to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation for our Family of Parishes. I'm thankful to all of the Confirmandi, families and parishioners of St. Joseph and Our Lady of the Woods for being so accommodating to our Confirmandi. We are celebrating these sacraments on a Sunday because it's the Lord's day, and we should be experiencing these great moments in the context of the faith communities in which these young people come from!




Walk for Life



Mission of the Sacred Heart Rosary Makers

I thought I would take a moment to share the mission and the workings of the Sacred Heart Rosary makers: About 15 years ago, a wonderful man by the name of Ed, a St. Joe's Trenton parishioner, heard we wanted to learn to make mission rosaries. Since this was his love, he readily agreed to come over and teach us how to make mission rosaries. A mission rosary is made of cord and plastic beads. It cannot be sold. It must be given away. As the word "mission" implies, the aim is to give these rosaries to as many people as possible. It was a clumsy attempt for a period of time but eventually we got the hang of how to make beautiful mission rosaries. The next question became "How are we going to pay for the supplies needed? At first, we put a jar in church and received some donations. Ed then decided he would like to teach us how to make and sell handmade wire rosaries to pay for our expenses. That took a little longer to learn. I remember laughing and thinking he is a dreamer. It took days to make a wire rosary. But - time proved me wrong.

Through the Gathering Space table and your generous donations, we have been able to send close to 200,000 mission rosaries around the world and are available in every local hospital. Countries like Belize, Columbia, Canada, Nigeria, Ireland, etc. have been recipients of these rosaries. We have also been able to make financial donations to the Women's shelter, and a downtown Detroit church. About 300 backpacks filled with necessities for the homeless have been distributed. Over 100 wheelchair blankets and bibs have been donated to Nursing Homes. Another charity, "Sleep in Heavenly Peace" has received enough donations to provide 14 beds to children who otherwise would sleep on the floor. We are working on making more dreams into realities.
