JUNE 16, 2024

Ezekiel, in today's first reading, was reminding his contemporaries of an important truth: God is in charge. Just as God had called the enslaved forth from Egypt and made of them a people with a land of their own, so had God been at the heart of every aspect of Israel's history. Interpreting every high point ("I, the Lord ... lift high the lowly tree") and low point ("I, the Lord, bring low the high tree"), Ezekiel urged his people to remember they were rooted in God and to live in reliance on their Maker. Like Israel, we tend to focus more on ourselves, forgetting to rely on God in the process. The summer is a great time to take stock in where my trust is placed, and how my trust in God is reflected in my priorities, and how I spend my time and my energy. ... *Continued on p. 2*



... *Continued* With the first parable of today's Gospel, Mark has made a similar point. Farmers sow seeds and do all that is necessary to foster their growth. The seed sprouts, grows and ripens to harvest because it is God who gives the growth. Mark and Ezekiel shared their parables not to offer lessons in agriculture, but to remind believers that God is at the heart of all we are. We are not the center of the universe; rather, God is at the center of all that is. When we fail to realize this truth, we lose our roots and cannot grow. We bear no fruit.

But what can bring us back to our centeredness in God when

we are off-kilter or lost in navel-gazing? For the Israelites, suffering was often the factor that led them back to God. Because they attributed everything that happened, both good and bad, to God, whatever they suffered (losses in war, disease, famine, the exile) was viewed as a punishment for their sins and infidelity. Through the ministry of their prophets, they were able to accept suffering as a pruning of sorts to make them better and more fruitful servants of God. Even though we certainly can rely on God when we are suffering, our gratitude to God for His providence and protection in our lives can also fill us with joy and gratitude. In good times, and in bad, the creator of the universe, who ensures a great harvest desires a partnership with us. God assures with the gift of his grace. But he always equips us with charisms and everything we need to sow the seeds in his presence and providence in the world.

Go Make of All Disciples

What's a Parable?

Often times, like this weekend, during Ordinary Time, we hear parables. A parable is a short story based on a familiar life experience used to teach a spiritual lesson. It resembles the style of speaking Jesus used in much of his public ministry. When the disciples asked Jesus why he taught in parables, he simply responded that the mysteries of heaven are revealed to the disciples but not to others. In other words, ordinary people, uneducated, often farmers or other simple workers - needed a simple way to hear Jesus' message. The Greek for parable is, "comparison."

The Gospel today (Mark 4:26-34), often called the Parable of the Mustard Seed, speaks of seed being scattered on the ground in relation to the kingdom of God. Once a mustard seed is sown in the ground, it is the smallest of the seeds on earth. However, it becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches. This gospel text gives a clear sense of why Jesus used parables: "With many such parables, he spoke the word to the as they were able to understand it."

Often times, we read Scripture and don't know how to apply it to our lives. I know I need good preaching in my life to break open the Scriptures. Thankfully, our priests and deacons in our Family of Parishes break open the Scriptures well for us! But now it is our turn. How do you challenge yourself to open the Scriptures, come to a better understanding of Jesus' message to you? How do you share that with others? There are people out there who do not know Jesus. They need a simple message they can understand. And, if they are not coming to Church, they're not hearing it here! It is up to each of us to take the Word of God with us when we are sent forth from Mass each Sunday. Take that Word to the world!

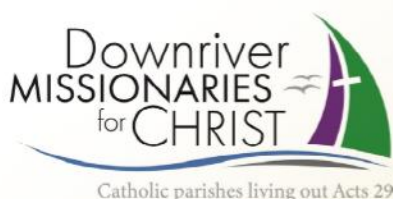
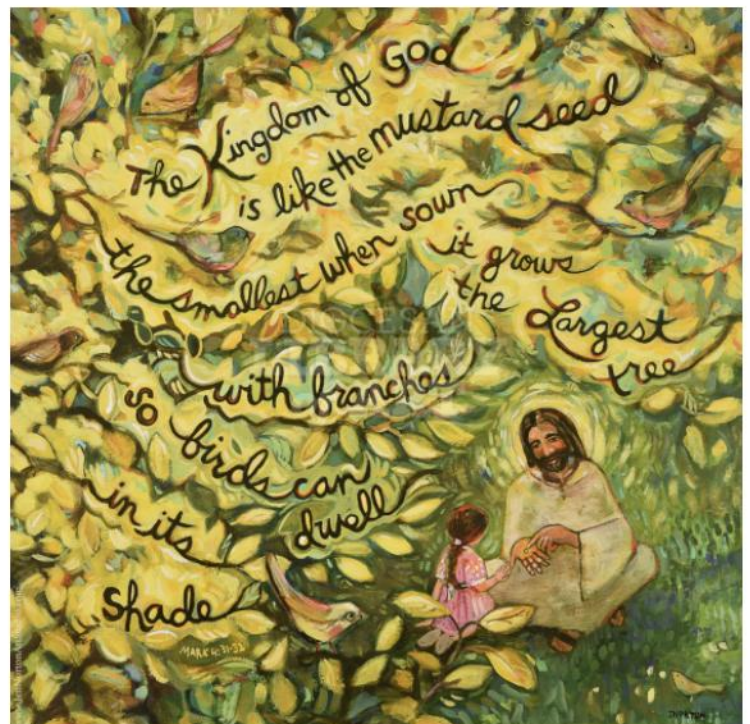

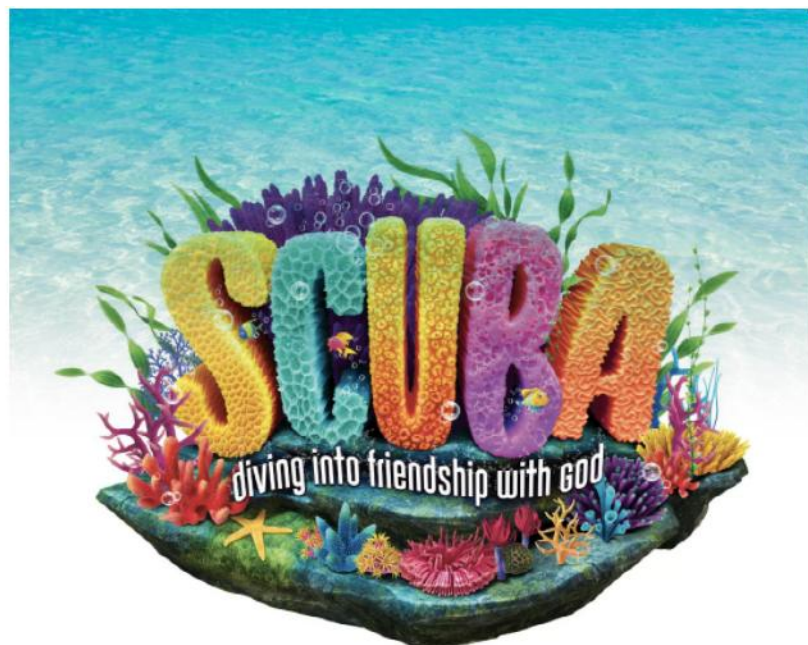

St. Vincent De Paul Conference

Since 1955, the St. Cyprian-St. Vincent De Paul Conference has been assisting Riverview residents, and other persons in the downriver area, with rental payments, utilities, food, household items, and numerous other ways. We have been able to do this ministry thanks to the generous support of St. Cyprian parishioners, parish staff members, and especially the support and cooperation of so many pastors through the years.



St. Vincent De Paul members (Vincentians) are a small group within a parish family. Without these dedicated people, this work would not happen. As an example of our ministry, this past year, either through home visits or supporting our neighboring SVDP parish Conferences, we have helped 43 adults and 41 children to pay rent, utilities, and supplying various household items. As Vincentians, we "are called to give any form of personal help to anyone in need, to alleviate suffering or deprivation, promoting human dignity and personal integrity."

During the time of the covid pandemic, we saw a reduction in the number of persons in our area seeking assistance. This past year, however, there has been an increase in numbers. Reflecting on future options, and after consultation with the St. Joseph, Trenton, SVDP Conference, we concluded that a merger between our two Conferences would strengthen our ministry going forward. Because St. Cyprian and St. Joseph parishes belong to the same Family of Parishes and are under the same leadership of Fr. Marc Gawronski, who supports this merger, both Conferences feel this merger is a good fit. The ministry of assisting Riverview residents would continue with this new merger. Also, we would continue to seek financial support from St. Cyprian parishioners as we have done over the years.

St. Cyprian parishioners have always been very generous in so many ways and we ask your prayers and support going forward with this new venture.
