Look! It's the Bread of Life! Last week we began a continuous proclamation of the 6th Chapter of John's gospel. After the wonders feeding with bread and fish in last Sunday's gospel, (John 6:1-15) it is no wonder the people continued to seek Jesus out! (John 6: 24-35) They wanted seconds! But Jesus offers us so much more: He offers us satisfaction for our deeper hungers; hungers that last a lifetime. He tries to help his followers today to raise their gaze, and their expectations. Where they want bread for now, Jesus offers food for eternal life. This food means belief "in the one who was sent."

Belief in Jesus, the Bread of Life comes with a cost, however; when we decide to live our lives as followers of Jesus, setting aside rancor and jealousy, and taking forgiveness and generosity... *Continued p2*

We need, as I have often said, to make the kingdom of heaven our horizon and our destination. Fast food will not suffice for us. Quick answers and speedy recovery are not always God's will for us. But if we trust in the Lord, who feeds us and answers all our needs, we will know that the "Bread of Life and the Cup of eternal salvation" we share in every Sunday sustains us for our journey.

Every Sunday in the Eucharistic prayer, the presider holds up the bread and wine after praying the words of Jesus: "This is my body... This is the cup of my blood." Then the priest is instructed to show the bread and then the chalice to the people so that the assembly can see them. Our "eucharistic praying" teaches us that is when the bread and wine are held up, we raise our eyes, to gaze and to contemplate the presence of the Risen Lord in His body and blood. If the presider's role is to "show" then the assembly's role must be to look, to gaze, and to contemplate. This is a way in which we can stir up our hunger and appreciation and reverence for the Body of Christ present in our midst. There are times when we bow our heads to demonstrate our reverence for the Eucharist, i.e.: immediately before receiving the Eucharist in the Communion procession. But the consecration seems to be a time for participating by looking just before we sing the Memorial Acclamation ("Let us proclaim the mystery of faith..."). We look, we recognize the mystery, we celebrate in the bread and wine, which have become the body and blood of Christ and then we sing that mystery together.

When the Body and Blood of Christ are lifted up, see the Bread of Life that feeds us. Ask yourself if you hunger for Christ, or if you have allowed the world to convince you to take Christ's presence for granted from time to time. Look! And see!

Sometimes we find ourselves grumbling like Israel in today's first reading. (Exodus 16: 2-4, 12-15) Join me in asking this week why we are always longing for more. Most of us are frequently dissatisfied with what we have. We begin to compare our lives with others; does that gain us anything other than bitterness and envy? God gives us all that we long for, certainly all that we need. We only need to see and believe in Jesus, who is the bread of life for us. "I am the bread of life; whoever comes to me will never hunger, and whoever believes in me will never thirst." (John 6: 35)

Are you ready to serve?

I love our second reading from last Sunday (Ephesians 4:1-6). Here, St. Paul is urging us to live the call we have received. In our baptism, God has given each one of us gifts and charisms for the use of ministry. Some may say that ministry is for the ordained or the trained lay minister. To minister to someone is to give assistance. It could be from becoming a Stephen Minister, helping with youth ministry, assisting as a catechist, but it could also be bringing the Eucharist to an elderly neighbor who is homebound. Maybe it could be just greeting someone that comes into Church (particularly someone you don't recognize). Being the presence of Christ to others does not require a theology degree.

What empowers us to be Christ's presence and be open to serving in some way or another? Our baptism. We have all we need through the one baptism we receive. "One Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all." This is our hope; this is the hope of our call. The responsorial Psalm last week as well was, "The hand of the Lord feeds us; he answers all our needs." May our needs be met in the Lord, but also may other's needs be met through our ministry, our service of the Body of Christ.

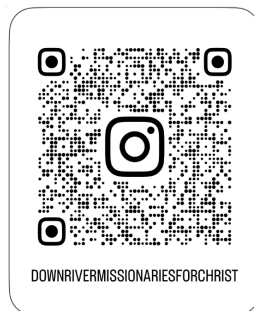

Accompanying the Bereaved at Sacred Heart Parish

'If one member suffers in the body of Christ which is the Church, all the members suffer with that member' (1 Corinthians 12:26). For this reason, those who are baptized into Christ and nourished at the same table of the Lord are responsible for one another.... So too when a member of Christ's Body dies, the faithful are called to a ministry of consolation to those who have suffered the loss of one whom they love. At Sacred Heart parish, we are aware of this responsibility and try to comfort the bereaved by assisting at the funeral liturgy, and through our bereavement group. Here are some ways in which you can share our hope in eternal life:

1. Attend the Funeral Mass: Your presence and prayer are a great source of comfort and out of shared faith in the resurrection we share with Christ when we celebrate the Eucharist.
2. Volunteer as a funeral Sacristan: This ministry helps our families to personally encounter the care and comfort of our parish community as we provide a reverent celebration of the Funeral Mass.
3. Welcome people at the Funeral Mass: Visitors and friends alike appreciate a warm welcome when they come to a funeral mass, with sad hearts, seeking hope in faith through our ministry of hospitality.
4. Visit the bereaved: a call, a card, or note and an invitation to spend some time together can go a long way to helping someone through grief. People who have lost a loved one can more easily empathize with someone who has recently experienced the loss of a family member.
5. Schedule a mass on an important anniversary, of the birth, the death, or the wedding anniversary of the faithful departed. The parish office would be happy to help you to maintain this age old tradition of praying for those who have died.
6. Bring photos of the deceased to be placed in front of the altar during the month of October, Plan on celebrating All Souls Day every year on November 2.
7. Visit the cemetery: Invite the bereaved to pay a visit and pray and remember at the grave of those who have died. For believers in Jesus, cemeteries are places of hope, that promise resurrection.

Please recall that permission to notify the parish of funerals that take place come from the members of the family of the faithful departed, and that not all families chose to participate in this notification.

We hope together to share in the eternal life Jesus won for us in his dying and rising. Let us share and strengthen that hope with each other.

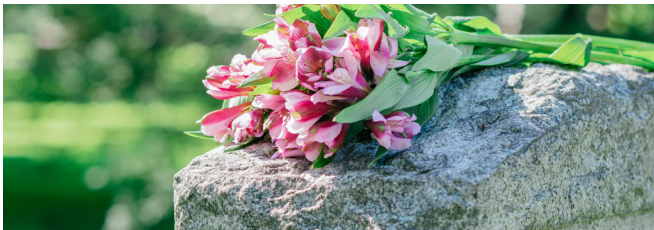

Becoming a Catholic Christian

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

The RCIA is the process by which people become members of the Catholic Church. Also known as the Catechumenate, it is a Journey of Faith, a process of growth and conversion that takes place through the proclamation of the Gospel, teaching of Catholic doctrine, and a gradual introduction to the customs and practices of Catholic life. This gradual development culminates in the celebration of the initiation of the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist at Easter.

The Rite is designed for:

- Those seeking Baptism, that is, those not baptized previously in another Christian denomination
- Any non-Catholic baptized in a Christian denomination and would like to learn about the Roman Catholic faith
- Any baptized Catholic, not raised in the faith, but now seeks to become a practicing Catholic

If you know someone who is looking for God in his/her life, if you know someone who may have expressed an interest in becoming a Catholic Christian, or may have simply asked you what Catholics believe, I encourage you to invite them to contact us at Sacred Heart Parish to have an introductory meeting.

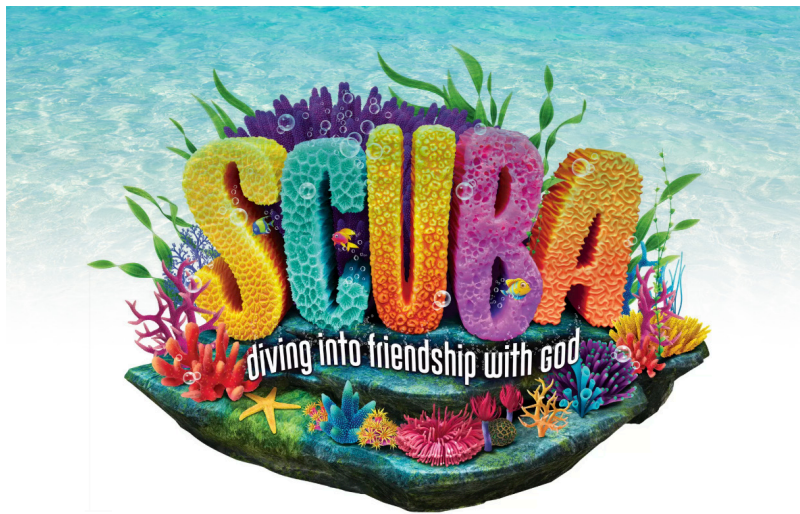

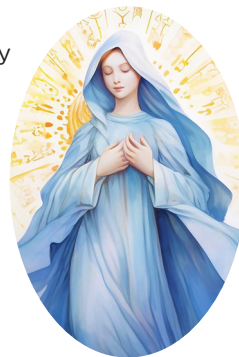
