24TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME
SEPTEMBER 15, 2024

The prophet Isaiah wrote four “Servant Songs” in the section called “the Book of Comfort” (chapters 40-55). Today we hear the third “song.” The person speaking sounds like someone who is trying to be faithful to a mission which has brought suffering.

Suffering tests our faith and our relationship with God. In cases of illness and misfortune we usually don’t have any choice in the matter. But the suffering the servant is undergoing is exactly because he/she is God’s servant. But the servant wants to be faithful because, “The Lord God opens my ears that I may hear.” Somehow this servant has heard that his/her suffering is for the cause of right and therefore believes that God will not abandon the one trying to be faithful.

Doing the right thing doesn’t guarantee we will succeed: it’s not about success, but about being faithful. When things don’t go the way the suffering servant expects, this servant has a piece of wisdom for us, “The Lord God is my help, therefore I am not disgraced.”

Who is this servant who speaks from the distant past, centuries before Christ? It could be a person trying to practice God's ways amid a disbelieving and hostile world. It could be the people of Israel, long suffering in exile, in a world far from their own, not only in language and customs, but belief as well. It could be a prophet, perhaps Isaiah himself, meeting opposition for speaking on behalf of God.

This worshipping community could also be the suffering servant, trying to live lives of faith in a world characterized by cynicism and opposing values. We Christians can also apply what is said of the servant to Jesus himself, who set his face "like flint" towards Jerusalem, preaching the gospel the Spirit had anointed him to proclaim. He would be faithful to his message, despite those who would, in Isaiah's words, beat him and pluck his beard.

The gospel today is a turning point in Mark's Gospel and questions about the identity of the servant of God take another shape. From now on Jesus will shift his attention from the crowds to the formation of his disciples. It seems as if they have begun a brief, but intensive course in discipleship; a training that will take them to Jerusalem and beyond. On his way to Jerusalem Jesus wants to be quite clear what awaits him and his disciples if they continue to follow him. Jesus' What is our measure of success in life? It is property or power? It is service and humility? Suffering is not always caused by the mission God has given us. When it is, like Jesus, we are called to bear witness to the mission, knowing that God is faithful, so we can be faithful too.

Go Make of All Disciples

The Lord opens my ear that I may hear...

These words from our First Reading (Isaiah 50:4c-9a) invite us to be docile to God's prompting in our lives. What role does God play in your life? When you're making decisions or needing to figure out some aspect of your life or what you should do, do you listen for God's voice? Now, more specifically to the ministries and programs in our parishes...the readings this weekend allow for some ideas around how we get involved, or don't get involved:

- **The First Reading from Isaiah** - "The Lord opens my ear that I may hear."

- **The Second Reading from James** - "What good is it to have faith without works."
- **The Gospel of Mark** - "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be last of all and the servant of all."

It is great to come to Church; however, if you're coming to Church but not sharing your gifts and your faith, St. James asks the question, "What good is it?" Let us be true servants to one another. Sometimes God calls us to things we may not be comfortable with, or think we have the capacity to do. Let us pray with these words today from Scripture. Allow God to open your ears that you may hear the call, but also be open to the Holy Spirit and the gifts you have received for the service of others.

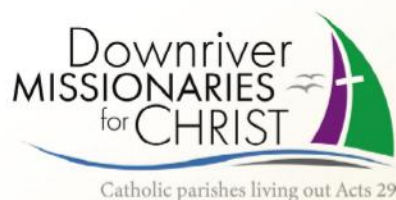

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

The **RCIA** is the process by which people become members of the Catholic Church. Also known as the Catechumenate, it is a Journey of Faith, a process of growth and conversion that takes place through the proclamation of the Gospel, teaching of Catholic doctrine, and a gradual introduction to the customs and practices of Catholic life. This gradual development culminates in the celebration of the initiation of the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist at Easter. **The Rite is designed for:**

- Those seeking Baptism, that is, those not baptized previously in another Christian denomination
- Any non-Catholic baptized in a Christian denomination and would like to learn about the Roman Catholic faith
- Any baptized Catholic, not raised in the faith, but now seeks to become a practicing Catholic

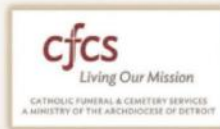
