28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME OCTOBER 13, 2024

Wisdom and wealth get contrasted today, along with the counterpoint of God's love, which rules all. Today we re-acquaint ourselves with an old friend: the rich young man. We may smile at his is inability to accept Jesus' invitation to discipleship because of his wealth. But could we? He has not embraced the wisdom of the First Reading: "[I] deemed riches nothing in comparison with [wisdom]." When faced with God's living word, the young man found himself unwilling to face the two-edged sword of the perfection (Second Reading). I've always imagined that the rich young man does exactly what Jesus instructs him to do, and that soon after this encounter, he returns to Jesus, showing up on the periphery of the crowds that followed Jesus. On that day, Jesus and the young man-made eye contact. Jesus smiled, and no more words were needed.

The gospel's overarching theme is God's constant love, which overcomes even our inability to let go of wealth. Indeed, Jesus "loved" the young man and recognized his sincerity.

Both the challenge of wisdom's call and the ultimate power of God's love—"All things are possible for God" (Gospel)—must echo in our hearts every day. We can neither dismiss the call to poverty, a challenging message in our society, nor can we fall into the trap of believing that following Jesus is some kind of a competition based on who gives up the most. The "both-and" quality of our tradition must be clear today: we are both saved by God's love and challenged to live that love "always determined to carry out good works" (from the Opening Prayer at mass this weekend). *Continued on p. 2*

Last weekend some literature was found in cars parked outside the church at Sunday masses at St. Joseph Parish. You can be assured I will never give permission for this kind of activity. When cars are parked on public property, we cannot prevent people from placing literature on cars. Remember you can access helpful reflection as you form your conscience to vote (if you haven't already voted) by searching the internet for "faithful citizenship."

With less priests available to staff parishes, many dioceses are having to close and consolidate parishes. We have experienced the impact of a lack of priests in all the parishes in our family at this point. You have been asked to remember St. Timothy Parish in your prayers as a transition team, composed of members of St. Timothy Parish and pastoral leaders faced critical reductions in its parish census, and a lack of resources to address capital improvement needs. The committee recommended that the parish close and the property be sold. This recommendation was sent to the Archbishop who consulted with the Presbyterial Council before he made a decision.

On September 16, 2024, Archbishop Allen Vigneron issued two decrees concerning Saint Timothy Parish, one of which affects St. Joseph and Our Lady of the Woods Parishes.

The first decree, which addresses the merger of St. Timothy parish, causes St. Timothy Parish to cease, merging a portion of the territory (east of Allen Road) into Saint Joseph Parish, and the remainder (west of Allen Road) into Our Lady of the Woods Parish. The second decree relegates St. Timothy Church to secular but not unbecoming use." This language from Canon law means the decree decommissions the property of St. Timothy for use as a church and allows for its eventual sale.

These decisions take effect on November 25, 2024, A certified copy of the decrees may be obtained from the Moderator of the Priests In Solidum, Father Marc Gawronski by calling the St. Joseph Parish office Trenton. The decrees are posted at the entrances of the churches in our Family of Parishes. For additional information and assistance in understating the details of this announcement you may write to chancellor@aod.org.

You are welcome to join us in an evening of prayerful remembering with the members of St. Timothy parish in the Social hall adjacent to the Church at 6:30 PM on Thursday, October 24. Please bring pictures, memories and prayers to share.

On Monday, November 4 we will hold our annual celebration of

the Commemoration of all the Faithful Departed at 7 PM at St. Timothy Parish.

Bishop Jeff Monforton will celebrate the last Mass at St. Timothy parish at 9:30 a.m. on November 24, the Solemnity of our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe.

St. Paul reminds us that" ...if one part of the body suffers, all the parts suffer with it; if a part is honored, all the parts rejoice with it." (1 Corinthians 12: 26) Please join me in praying for the people of St. Timothy parish, as we continue to work together, even in sad times, to hold on to the hope the Gospel gives us. Go Make of All Disciples

Have you heard about Blessed Solanus Casey?

The relic of Blessed Solanus Casey will be coming to our Family of Parishes at the end of October. There are different classes of relics, with this one being a first class relic - meaning it is a part of the person's body.




This relic that is coming is actually a bone from Solanus' hand. As he was a "simplex priest," he was not able to hear confessions or preach at Mass. However, so many came to him and talked to him as his role was to hold the door open for people to come and be served in Detroit at their soup kitchen.

So why saints? Why not just go directly to God in prayer? Have you ever asked for someone to pray for you? Since the birth of the Church, we have been praying to saints. The saints essentially direct us to Jesus. To become a canonized saint, there must be miracles attributed to the person. At Solanus' beatification in Detroit in 2017, a woman with a skin disease who was cured through the intercession of Solanus carried his relic in procession. Solanus does not do the healing, God does the healing through Solanus' intercession. As the relic comes to your parish, please make it a point to come in prayer with the community. Allow this to be a moment of healing and peace in your life.

We venerate the relics of saints. We worship God. Veneration in this sense is not worship, but through the saint's intercession and example, we can grow in holiness and virtue. Veneration does not detract from the glory we should be giving God. Whatever good the saints possess is due to God's activity in their lives. That activity

can continue to be poured into all of us through the prayer of the saints. May each of us continue to grow in holiness and virtue through the example of Solanus and other saints we can model our lives after.


