32ND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME NOVEMBER 10, 2024

Sometimes the most interesting people in the Gospels are the ones whose names we never learn. Take, for example, the widow in today's gospel: Her loss and suffering were allowed to teach her incredible lessons and they did not lead her down the road of negativity, despair, or frustration. She learned that life is much more than what someone "has" and all about what one has "become." Trust and faith in God are paramount over anything one can acquire, own, or become. Developing patience, which is rooted in suffering, is what will ultimately bring people happiness. For the widow, life is a precious gift.

Our first reading this week from the First Book of Kings demonstrates what happens when we learn from the widow's abiding trust in God. For this widow, "the jar of flour did not go empty, nor the jug of oil run dry, as the LORD had foretold through Elijah." The author of Psalm 146 discovered the same mystery as did our two widows.



If we have become accustomed in life to proving our point, getting ahead, teaching someone a lesson, showing someone who's boss, and being defensive then we are engaging in battle. Sometimes, as in the case of our beginning story, this battle has an incredible outcome. In attempting to win, we lose.

Whereas there is nothing negative, weak, needy, or pathetic in either the widow from Kings or the widow from the Gospel. In fact, the opposite is true. Their ability to trust makes them strong! It gives them courage, centers them, provides confidence, brings contentment, gives example, and speaks of abundance! By their choices, these two widows balance the scales and bring order to disorder. They chose to embrace what life has given, graces and hardships, and learn from the lessons they teach. In short, they act out of love.

In the end, we are all destined for love, but it takes an embrace of life and whatever it brings to discover it. Sadly, for many the battle continues. We can only hope and pray that by giving good example ourselves they can see the light. Only then will we find our path back to God.



# Go Make of All Disciples

### Do you give your whole livelihood to God?

When we trust in God and give what we think is more than we can, we learn God provides. This time of year, we often feel the tug to help so many charitable endeavors. The woman in today's Gospel (Mark 12:38-44) gave out of her poverty. Notice Jesus does not comment on the fact that wealthy people put in a lot of money, but the poor widow who only put in two small coins. "She, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood." Her gift meant she had to rely on God to supply even her next meal. Such a reckless generosity parallels God's self-emptying generosity.


This message and my own words are not a ploy to get you to donate more! If you feel called to do so, please do! But I want to have you consider the disposition of a giver. Fr. Rooney once spoke in a homily how people can sometimes be leery of giving money to the poor. "They may buy alcohol or drugs with it!" Fr. Rooney's response was that God isn't going to judge us for what someone else did with the money we donated. He's going to judge us on how we

did or did not minister to the poor in our midst. That was a powerful realization for me. The responsorial Psalm this weekend speaks of this as well (Psalm 146): "The Lord keeps faith forever, secures justice for the oppressed, gives food to the hungry. The Lord sets captives free." God does this through you and I. As we give food to the hungry, or raise up those who are bowed down through various charitable acts, we are doing so because it is an offering to God. Our task as a Christian is to see Christ in the people outside the baseball field holding a cup for money, or the person at the side of the freeway.

Our parishes will all be participating in some charitable work this next couple of months (thanksgiving baskets, giving trees, etc.). I urge you not only to give what you can to serve the hundreds our Christian Service ministries will be assisting, but also give with a generous and loving heart, with concern for the poor. As you pack up a food basket, or drop clothes off, or participate in some other way, pray for the people your gifts will serve. Allow God to change your heart in the process. That is what being a disciple is all about, directing our hearts and minds to the One whom we follow: Jesus Christ.

# ESCHATOLOGY: THE LAST THINGS

### What happens after we die?

This is the question that is deep in the human heart and we have been asking that question since the dawn of time. We have archaeological evidence that the earliest humans buried their dead with items indicating a hope for an afterlife. In modern times, a Google research for "life after death" comes up with two BILLION results. With a mixture of curiosity, fear, and hope, all of us long to know what happens after death.

The Church has long taught that prayerful consideration of that area of theology called Eschatology, which is the "study of last things" which are various final moments or stages: death, particular judgment, purgatory, heaven, hell, Second Coming of Christ, general judgment, consummation of all things in the perfection of the Kingdom of God. This study is an essential part of our growth and maturation as Christians. Unless we take these things seriously, our life here on earth will lack meaning and focus. It is only when we consider the decisions we make in the light of eternity that our entire lives begin to make sense and our relationship with God can come to full maturity.
