Go Make of All Disciples

Why did Jesus need to be baptized?

Each of us has a purpose. John the Baptist's purpose was to spread an eager hopefulness that Jesus is in fact the long-awaited Messiah. His role is to lead people to repentance to prepare the way of the Lord. We almost take on an Advent theme this weekend as we conclude the Christmas Season. Now that Jesus has come and been made present to us, we can echo the Psalmist (Psalm 104), "O Lord, my God, you are great indeed!" As we proclaim the greatness of the Lord, we recognize Jesus' baptism as the beginning of his public ministry. Just as he began this great work, beginning at his baptism, we also are called to ministry. This does not mean that everyone has to leave their careers and become missionaries, or work full time in the Church. For some, it sure does! But for many, we are called to use our gifts at the service of God and God's people.

The Holy Spirit drives the action of Jesus' baptism - as well as our own. The early disciples relied heavily on the Spirit to inspire their meetings, words, and actions. A very simple prayer than can welcome this reliance is simply, "Come, Holy Spirit." How might the things we do and the decisions we make change if we began with, "Come, Holy Spirit?" Our baptism was not a one-and-done experience. It was the beginning of something very powerful. With the gift of the Spirit poured out on us in Baptism, and further manifested in Confirmation, Jesus comes into our midst and walks alongside us in our desire for communion with God and one another.

As we are invited to individually discern and consider how God wants to use our gifts for ministry, it may not be sending us to another country to do missionary work. It may just be something simple like bringing communion to a homebound neighbor or family member, or finding a way to get more involved in your parish community. Don't just say that someone else will take care of it that is more equipped. God has given you in your baptism all you need!




Protecting God's Children Workshop







Greetings from St. Joseph School!

Starting with the Theological Virtues, November's virtue of the month was Faith. Students discussed what Faith means, and how we show faith




