FR. CRAIG'S CONTEMPLATIONS

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord,

As you all know, people learn differently. If you think back for a moment to High School or College. Some took notes diligently, while others stared at the board and listened intently. Some minds retain by repetition and others by experience. (I am guilty of needing to write out flash cards.) Setting all that aside, one of the most effective teachings methods is the use of stories.

This week's sacred readings offer three different styles of "stories" if you will. St. Peter is delivering "eyewitness" testimony of the ministry of Jesus Christ to followers and new believers alike. He is recounting past events and prophecies and putting them into a new context, encapsulating all that Jesus did in just a few short sentences. Then in the second reading, St. Peter, again, is bearing witness to Christ's life and work but in much wider historical context. Rather than sharing "glory stories" about their days in ministry, our first Pope (St. Peter) is demonstrating {historically} how Jesus was always the Father's plan for salvation for each one of us.

The Gospel, I humbly suggest, the most compelling story, is the "Road to Emmaus" story. Through the power and working of the Holy Spirit, through St. Luke. We hear how Jesus "draws near" and ask the travelers about their "story." After listening, Jesus then weaves together story after story from the Torah and the prophets all the while walking them to the Eucharistic table. And so, practically, when we slow down long enough to reflect on our life and how God is present and has always been present, we begin to see how God was with us, always with us, even in some of the most challenging parts of life, He is with us. As always, the stories of our lives are woven into the ultimate story of life, which begin and end in Him at the sacred altar.

On a personal note, I would like to thank Deacon Matthew for his time with us at St. Anne. He has been such a blessing to our Parish. Please pray for him as he now prepares for priestly ordination for the Diocese of Marquette. May God be with you!



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

"I Am Not Afraid — I Was Born to Do This."

Have you ever felt like you weren't doing the work you should be doing?

We have all had jobs that leave us feeling unfulfilled. Bored. Dreading the next day. We may even experience a sensation of unfamiliarity, of being unable to recognize ourselves.

Most of us have also been lucky enough to have a job that we love — a vocation, a calling that makes us look in the mirror and think, This. This is who I'm supposed to be. I recognize this person.

For me, that work is the work of marriage and motherhood. The hours are terrible, the pay is even worse, and my coworkers are frequently disappointed in me — but it doesn't matter. When I look in the mirror every morning and see my tired, wrinkled face gazing back, choruses of "I said I don't want the BLUE SHIRT, MOMMY, ugh!" and "Honey, I've got an early meeting, I'm so sorry but I have to run," ringing in the background, I think to myself: I recognize this girl. She was born to do this.

Christ's own disciples did not recognize him on the road to Emmaus. It wasn't until he took the bread and broke it that their eyes were opened, and they realized they had known it all along — "Were not our hearts burning within us?"

In that moment, Christ was doing the very work he was born to do, making the sacrifice.

I don't know what kind of vocation you are called to. I don't know what kind of work reveals your true self. But I hope that whatever work you are doing, you can look in the mirror and feel your heart burning within you.

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC LIFE EXPLAINED

Question: What are the requirements for being a confirmation sponsor?

Answer:

Although many dioceses have specific requirements for who can be a sponsor for the Sacrament of Confirmation, the Code of Canon Law identifies certain requirements that are true for all dioceses and parishes. First, the sponsor should be chosen by the one to be confirmed (or, in some cases, by the parents or even the pastor). Second, a sponsor must be at least sixteen years old (unless the local bishop has chosen another age, or a special exception has been made). Third, the sponsor must be a Catholic who has been confirmed and who has already received the Sacrament of the Eucharist. Beyond this, they must lead "a life of faith in keeping with the function to be taken on." Fourth, they can have no sort of canonical penalty or impediment. Finally, they cannot be either the father or mother of the one to be confirmed (See Canons 893, §1 and 874, §1).

In some cultures, it is customary for one of the confirmand's godparents to act as sponsor, although this is not required by Church law.

To learn about the requirements for your parish or diocese, you can consult your pastor or your parish or diocesan director of religious education or the diocese's office liturgy and worship.
