


Thoughts from Fr. John

Dec. 24th, the Eve of Christmas

Happy Birthday, Our Lord Jesus Christ!

Although birthday parties are commonplace in American culture, celebrating birthdays in the Catholic liturgical calendar is rare and focuses completely on the turning point of human history.

Only three birthdays are being celebrated in the liturgical calendar, namely, Jesus's birth (December 25), Mary's birth (September 8), and John the Baptist's birth (June 24). Even though Mary's birth and John the Baptist's birth are underscored, we notice that their births only prepare for the coming of Jesus. For Mary, she is the "God-Bearer" ("Theotokos," Θεοτόκος), the Mother of God; John the Baptist, the "Forerunner" and the "Witness" ("witness/martyr,""μαρτυρίαν") to Jesus. In short, Mary's and John the Baptist's birth do not stand alone but utterly depend on Jesus's Nativity.

To all of us who celebrate birthdays every year, we should think about how our birthday celebrations must also depend on Christmas: Jesus's Birth brings new light and hope to the world. May our celebration of Christmas this year bring Christ's Light and Hope to the world and light up our own

birthdays, whenever they may be.



I am not going to wish you a Merry Christmas.

I have no problem with merriness, and I certainly hope you have your share of it today. May the frosting on your cookies be extra thick. May the lights of your tree be particularly twinkly. May the crackling of your fire be especially pleasant, and the places around your table filled by smiling loved ones. No, there is nothing wrong with being merry, especially on such a day.

But the angels did not bring news of great merriment. They brought news of great joy, and though our world often confuses the two, they are not the same thing.

Joy is harder to achieve than merriness, but it's easier to keep because it is far, far more durable. Joy can withstand the roughness of this earthly life in a way that merriness never could. Merriness does not shiver in a stable or hang on a cross. But joy can, and it has.

Question: Why do we give gifts at Christmas?
