Thoughts from Fr. John

Coming to Ash Wednesday and Lent

Ash Wednesday (Feb. 14) marks the beginning of the Lenten Season. It aims to prepare us for Jesus's Passion, Death, and Resurrection (Easter Sunday, March 31). The rite of smearing ashes on the foreheads is "a sign of our mortality and penitence." The Lenten Season—lasts six weeks —serves as a time for spiritual reflection and a way to turn toward God through our communal prayer and fasting.

The communal aspect of the Lenten observances is first displayed in smearing ashes by a priest (and by extension, the Liturgical Ministers who had been commissioned). While smearing the ashes in the shape of a cross, the priest also recites publicly these words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" (Genesis 2:7); Alternatively, "Repent and believe in the Gospel" (Mark 1:14). The entire rite conveys that this is a communal act and should be done appropriately with one's community. Therefore, the Church encourages the faithful to attend Ash Wednesday with the Eucharist and receive the ashes on their foreheads as one community not as individual act at their convenience. To accommodate your hours, St. Anne's will provide two masses on Ash Wednesday, one will be at 9:00 am in the Morning and the other at 7:00 pm in the Evening (please also check out other Ash Wednesday mass time within the Family of Parishes, Our Lady of the Lakes, St. Daniel, and St. Rita). 

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Historically, Ash Wednesday follows early traditions, originated from the Church of Rome. The penitents and sinners enter into a period of public penance. Ash Wednesday, then, signifies the beginning of Christian communities' journey together toward Easter, in view of our earthly death being conquered by Jesus's resurrection. It is important for us to witness to this conviction together. We must draw strength from one another as early Christians did. Moreover, to wear ashes in a sign of cross witnesses to a different reality and understanding of life and death, which stands as a staking contrast to the American culture(s) in which Christians live. Now, we must unite more than ever and stand against cultures that celebrate death rather than life (see Richard M. Doerflinger's article on "False Freedom and the Culture of Death," Body).

Overall, by the nature of Ash Wednesday and its historical development, the Church calls us out and journey together to witness to a culture of life in Christ, not a culture of death in oneself.

Why "Evangelical Charity"?

Following up on my article of last week, I know that "Evangelical Charity" is a new term – I'm still getting used to it myself!

Marker 8.4 of Unleash the Gospel is entitled "Evangelical Charity," a term that reminds us that when the Church does good works, we are not trying to do the work of a social service agency, but the work of the Gospel! 'Evangelical' as an adjective means, "according to the Gospel." Charity is "the theological virtue by which we love God above all things for his own sake, and our neighbor as ourselves for the love of God." So when we use the term "Evangelical Charity," we mean that our love for God will overflow through a love for our neighbors as the Gospel has called for us to do. It goes deeper than just "doing" Christian Service.

As Archbishop Vigneron writes in Marker 8.4 on Evangelical Charity: "Our service to the poor and marginalized needs to be a clear witness to Jesus our Lord, not mistaken for humanist philanthropy ... In recent decades ... there has been a tendency for Catholic charitable work to become separated from our primary calling to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ. It is time to overcome that distinction. We need to ensure that in ministering to the material needs of others, we are also responding to their spiritual thirst for God. Every Catholic charitable work must also be an authentic expression of Catholic faith. We must be unabashed to speak the name of Jesus and to invite every person to the fullness of life in him. The world needs the light that is in Christ alone."

We see the face of Christ in those we minister to. We see to their bodily and spiritual needs. We love them as Jesus does. And we share the Good News with all we encounter.
