Over the years, I was fortunate to have lived with a few Irish priest friends. One of them was also a "Patrick." Naturally, I got some Irishness rubbed on me and grew quite fondly of Saint Patrick and his life. He exemplified how to live a life from "slave to saint," a story of God's transformative power, to which we all must lend our ears every time we celebrate St. Patrick's Day.

Ethically speaking, I am the furthest from being an Irish person. However, St. Patrick is one of the Saints closest to me spiritually. Just like St. Patrick was called to preach to his people after receiving Jesus Christ as his Lord, I also dreamt that I could bring the Good News of Jesus to my people once I had finished my studies of theology. That spiritual connection was real and strong ever since I read St. Patrick's life and writings.

Let's read his own words preserved in Confessio [Confession] of St. Patrick:

"(1) I, Patrick, am a sinner, the most uncultured and smallest among all the faithful, indeed many people consider me to be worthless... I was captured when I was almost sixteen years old. I did not really know the true God when I was brought in slavery to Ireland together with thousands of others. All of us deserved this slavery because we had turned away from God and did not keep His commandments. We had not been obedient to our priests, who were encouraging us to do those things necessary for salvation... (2) Here the Lord revealed to me my sense of unbelief so that I could repent of my sins and turn with my whole heart to the Lord my God. God looked at my misery and had mercy upon my youth and ignorance. He watched over me before I knew Him and before I could tell right from wrong: He had compassion for me just as a father has for his son. (3) I cannot be silent, nor would it be helpful, about all the gifts and graces that the Lord in His mercy bestowed upon me in the land of my slavery. Indeed, this is how we ought to behave. After being punished by God, we must praise Him and tell of His marvels to every nation under the heavens." (Excerpt From St. Patrick: His Confession and Other Works by Fr. Neil Xavier O'Donoghue, 2009)

The three paragraphs summarize three qualities of a saint: humble, repentant, and ready to proclaim God's grace to others. Let us celebrate St. Patrick with the color green, representing the new life of the Spring in Christ's Resurrection, not the color of the disguise to cover our unsavory desires. Speak of God's mercy with humble and contrite hearts. Happy St. Patrick's Day!

Notes from Nancy

I'm a couple of months into my Evangelical Charity ministry here at St. Anne's, and I *think* I'm starting to find my rhythm. I have had the pleasure of meeting quite a few of you; thank you for welcoming me so warmly!

As I mentioned in one of my first bulletin articles, the ministry of Evangelical Charity includes eight specific and often overlapping lenses, as outlined on the Archdiocese of Detroit website (https://www.aod.org/evangelicalcharity):

- 1) Human Services: Ministries aimed at addressing a specific human need (like hunger, housing, etc.)
- 2) Care Ministries: Ministries aimed at caring for a specific population of individuals (like seniors, those with disabilities, etc.)
- 3) Community Outreach: Ministries and activities that partner with and/or support other community agencies and efforts.
- 4) Mental Health and Crisis: Ministries that respond to the mental health and crisis needs of community members through the combination of direct and spiritual support.
- 5) Bereavement: Ministries that accompany community members as they find hope and healing through the grief process.
- 6) Pro-Life Ministries: Ministries that support-- through prayer, education, advocacy and pastoral service-- the dignity of life from conception to natural death seeking to build a culture of life.
- 7) Fraternal Organizations: Societies and conferences that operate for the service of the parish and the poor and for the Christian formation and fraternal support of their membership.
- 8) Justice Ministries: Ministries that advocate for justice and advance the vision of Catholic Social Teaching in the parish and the public square.

I have sooooo many ideas, but do not want to duplicate efforts. If you are involved with any ministries listed above, I would love to chat with you about what that looks like at St. Anne! Have ideas for things within these "lenses" that we aren't currently doing? I'd love to hear about those ideas! My office hours are on Tuesday and Friday mornings, but I could make myself available at times more convenient for you.
