#### From the Desk of Father Hahn:

#### Thank you

A big thank-you to Alex Brady, who has served so well as organist and cantor in our parish over the last number of years. Alex began during High School helping out and then after Valerie Tanner moved, he took it full-time and has done a great job. His studies and work in Columbus have now made it too difficult to make the trek every Sunday. We will certainly miss him! Please stop over for a reception in the parish hall after Mass today and express your gratitude for the great job he has done in bringing such beauty to the liturgy!

#### All Saints and All Souls

A reminder that this Friday, November 1 is a Holy Day of Obligation, the Feast of All Saints. Mass will be celebrated here at 5:30 p.m. on Friday. Saturday, November 2, is the Feast of All Souls – a day to pray for all of our beloved deceased. Mass will be held here Saturday morning at 8:30 a.m.

#### **Altar Server Vesture**

You will soon be noticing a slight change in the dress of some of our servers. The boys will now dress in cassock (the black robe) and surplice (the white upper garment) and the girls will dress in the white alb. Why is that? Priests normally dressed in a cassock when they were out in the world. They would then put on an alb when they were celebrating the Mass (with the other vestments going over the alb – as we still do today). Cassocks were (and are – to a degree) the "street" dress of a priest. Boys would traditionally serve in cassock and surplice as a way to help them see themselves as a priest. That is, it would help them to discern the vocation, the way that a boy in the civil air patrol might wear a uniform that in some way resembles the Air Force's in order to identify them and also to help them envision themselves wearing that "permanently." The cassock then for centuries has been exclusively normal male street attire (for priests). An alb was a special set of clothing and used only for the Mass. In recent times when the Church allowed girl altar servers and other lay ministers, the alb was the preferred choice of dress for the Mass for lay ministers – as it is exclusively used for sacred service. At St. Mary, the boys now will wear the "street" clothes of the priest (although with the sacred clothes - the surplice) with the hope that it helps them envision themselves as, and be more open to, a vocation to the priesthood. The girls wear the sacred vestment of the Mass, the alb, since, as female, their unique gifts to the Church do not include the possibility of serving as a priest. It is even more fitting that their white alb matches the white habit of our beloved Franciscan Sisters. What a beautiful vocation to envision themselves in!

In Christ, Father Hahn **SPECIAL NOTE:** I am thrilled to be able to accompany Father and the other members of our consortium on our Pilgrimage to the Holy Lands in early November! Therefore, Wednesday, November 6th and Wednesday, November 13th, the Parish Office will be closed.
