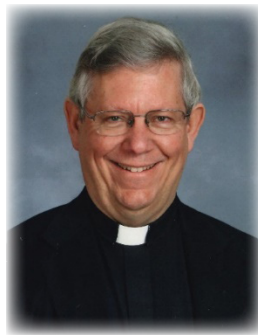

**A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR:**

Dear Parishioners:

Blessings to you on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord!

As we conclude the Season of Christmas, we are invited by the Church to call to mind the moment when Jesus experienced the Baptism by John and His public ministry began. As the Lord entered the water, He made Himself one with sinners. This act of solidarity also served to be the first public revelation of the Most Blessed Trinity. The Father spoke to Jesus in His human nature, affirming the relationship. They shared from all Eternity: "You are My beloved Son; with You I am well pleased." At the same moment, "the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus in



bodily form like a dove." This Sacramental Moment opened a way of living that still flows today. The One Who was baptized by John has in His turn baptized us "with the Holy Spirit and fire."

As we begin a New Year, let us open our hearts to the action of the Spirit, transforming us to be a true witness of the life of Faith and of the power of the Gospel at work in us. Renew your own baptismal commitment. Allow the Spirit to enliven in you the gifts that create Unity. Seek the "higher gifts" of Faith, Hope and Love, and allow them to flow through you. If you have been away from the Sacraments, find a way to return.

Now is the time to invite others to rediscover the beauty of our Catholic Faith. Following the Lord's example, we must make ourselves one with all who cross our path. **Offering a Mass** for a special intention is a long-standing tradition in the Catholic Church. It is usually considered that special graces are obtained for whom the Mass is said.

This is because the Church considers the Mass as the greatest possible prayer of intercession insofar as it is the perfect offering of Christ to the Father by making present the paschal mystery of His death and Resurrection.

Because of the particular role of the priest as mediator between God and man, acting "in persona Christi" when offering the holy sacrifice of the Mass, it is usually considered that special graces may be obtained when he applies the Mass to a particular intention.

Masses are offered for many reasons; for the souls in purgatory or in remembrance for someone who is deceased, or someone who is ill or having a special occasion.

A Mass Intention may also be set for:

1. A deceased loved one;
2. A living person who is sick or suffering;
3. A living person who is celebrating a birthday, anniversary or other special moment in their life;
4. In thanksgiving to God (including the Lord Jesus or the Holy Spirit);
5. In thanksgiving for a favor granted through the intercession of a Blessed or a Saint;
6. For a prayer intention (so long as the intention does not contradict Church teaching).

We also have envelopes in the back of church for this purpose.

**Fr. Stinnett's Scribbles**

This weekend, we take a special moment to remember the Baptism of the Lord. The Church is giving us an opportunity to reflect on the words of revelation that come from the heavens: "You are My beloved Son; with You I am well pleased." Jesus Christ did not become the Son of God at His Baptism; He is the Son of God from all eternity. The words of the Father confirm that the life of Jesus is no ordinary life. His life is Life Himself in the flesh. Jesus is the One Who will wash away the sins of His Bride, the Church. Jesus' Baptism begins His public ministry, the last three years of His earthly life. Everything He will do is contained in the words of the Father: "You are My beloved Son; with You I am well pleased." In addition to the revelation of Jesus' divinity, the mystery of the Blessed Trinity is also revealed. We hear the voice of the Father, Jesus is revealed as the Son, and the Holy Spirit descends from the heavens in the form of a dove, as He is represented in artwork down to our own day.

In remembering the Baptism of Jesus, we should also take a moment to remember our own Baptism. Most of us were baptized as infants, so we have no actual memory of the event. Maybe you have an old family video of your Baptism, or some pictures. Regardless, we can remember our own Baptism by recalling what happens to each soul at the moment of its Baptism, and how well we live up to the great gift that is bestowed on us in Baptism. We all know our birthdays, but do you remember the date of your Baptism? If not, it is something good to look up, if you can. I was baptized on July 7, 1996 at Immaculate Conception Church by then-Father, now Monsignor Anthony Missimi. Like on our birthdays, we celebrate the gift of another year of life and the joy of being alive and our own uniqueness in the world, so too on our Baptism Day, we should celebrate the gift of another year of spiritual life and the joy of having God's own Divine Life dwell within us and the uniqueness of being a Christian, a beloved son or daughter of God.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* lists these as some of the effects of Baptism: the forgiveness of sins and washing away of the original sin we inherit from Adam and Eve; incorporation into the Mystical Body of Christ, the Church; we are made priest, prophet, and king with Christ; and we receive an indelible mark on our souls, called a character, which permanently marks our souls as Christians. In Baptism, our sins are washed away, but we do not always keep ourselves in this state of grace. When we sin mortally, we put up a barrier to the grace of God dwelling within us. We are still temples of the Holy Spirit, but the temple is empty. God is always ready to come back into His Temple; He *wants* to dwell within us. By making a good Confession, we renew the graces we receive in Baptism. This is called sanctifying grace, or in the Latin tradition, *gratia gratum faciens*, literally "grace making us pleasing [to God]." St. Thomas Aquinas says that sanctifying grace is the "kind of grace [...] that through it a man is himself joined to God" (*STh*. I-II, q. 111, a. 1, co.). In remembering our own Baptism, we strive to live always in a state of grace, and we implore God's mercy when we sin. God is always ready to forgive, so long as we humble ourselves and receive it.

**Parish Notes****Covid Protocols in place**

We remind you to attend the health of the whole community by respecting the protocols in place during this "Covid time." We must do all we can to ensure that we keep one another safe. This requires following "best practices" that have been learned through the two years we have dealt with this hidden menace. It also means having concern for one another's emotional well-being, helping others to feel comfortable by being willing to do some things that are personally inconvenient. Please wear a mask in church, sanitize often, and keep proper social distance beyond your own "circle." These actions, chosen out of love, can be a way of building up a place of welcome and of true Christian love.

If your health is compromised in any way, know that you are for that very reason relieved of the obligation of being present in person. Following the Mass by live-stream is not the same as being there with the community, but you are able to share something with us. Be assured that you are in our prayers.

**The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick**

Over the holidays, we had many requests for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. As you can imagine, the unusual schedules of these days, with so many extra Masses, made it difficult at times to respond as quickly as we would have liked.

We encourage those in need of anointing to contact their parish. If it is after hours or if the office happens to be closed, leave a message on the main parish line, then call the emergency number as well: 740-774-1407, ext. 9. It is very important that you use this line for any emergency such as an anointing in a hospital or to leave news of a funeral. Messages on any other line may not be received in a timely manner. Realize that the priests are in service of three different parishes, each with its own office. The emergency line is checked several times each day. But don't wait until it is an emergency! Feel free to request an anointing from any of the priests when you feel the need. When Covid protocols are ready to be lifted, we will be arranging times for this at all the weekend Masses.

A pastoral note: Some may not realize that Fr. Tim Hayes, our pastor, is diabetic, and therefore has an underlying condition that makes it impossible for him to work directly with active Covid situations. Fr. Milton Kiocha is here primarily for hospital and prison ministry, so he will often be the one who is free to attend to emergency calls. Fr. Jacob Stinnett also goes out regularly to see to the needs of our shut-ins. All of us keep you daily in our prayers and are mindful of your needs. Please trust that we are doing what we can given the limitations of our situation.

- The evangelization of all the higher educational centers in the diocese,
- The use of social and digital media for evangelization,
- The support and utilization of lay missionaries and apostolates, and
- The development of a soft-entry evangelization center for outreach to seculars and "nones."

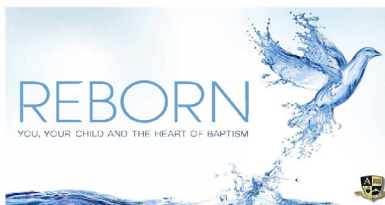
