Rome Delegation – March/April 2022

Update to Dioceses Re Rome Delegation (Indigenous Healing & Reconciliation)

Enclosed you will find information relating to the upcoming delegation to Rome, where Indigenous delegates will be meeting with the Holy Father, March 28 – April 1, 2022. This is a critically important moment in the healing and reconciliation journey.

Dioceses may choose to support the events in Rome in a number of ways. They include:

- a) **Prayer** Prayers of the Faithful, Mass intentions and other prayerful moments in solidarity with those meeting with the Holy Father in Rome. For example, one diocese plans to offer adoration at a church identified as a prayer hub during the delegation. As previously communicated, the Our Lady of Guadalupe Circle has invited communities to participate in a Sacred Fire and Prayer Wave. More information on this initiative can be found here.
- b) **Sharing of information** social media posts, website updates, links, etc. to raise awareness. See the example of a delegate profile from the Archdiocese of Edmonton here. The CCCB twitter account @CCCB_CECC will provide regular updates, with statements or other information posted to the CCCB website. Salt & Light Catholic Media Foundation will livestream media briefings as well as the final audience with the Holy Father on April 1, 2022 in addition to special programming their website, www.slmedia.org will be a valuable resource throughout the delegation.
- c) **Communication from the local bishop** to the faithful (could be a message on the website, brief message to be shared with the faithful in parishes, etc.).
- d) **Media interviews** your diocese may be contacted to offer insight/commentary regarding the Rome delegation from a local perspective. If you have individuals directly engaged in the healing and reconciliation journey, they may be valuable voices to speak in a more general way to the significance of the delegation. Messaging (enclosed) for bishops or diocesan communication staff on a variety of topics may also assist in responding as required.
