Dear St. Anthony Parishioners and Families,

I'm writing this on the day after the Mission has come to a close. It has been three amazing days of seeking Christ's light and taking steps to really dwell in it. Each night during the talks, as much as I loved hearing Lenny, I really loved looking around at each of your faces. I saw wide eyes taking everything in, smiles, brows furrowed in concentration, and a few tears at times. Our parish needed these three days.

And each night during the socials, as much as I loved eating the food (tatertots!), again, I really loved looking around at each of your faces. I saw eyes twinkling with laughter, smiles of friendship, and looks of true care and camaraderie. It brought me so much joy as your pastor to see all of us together.

Our Mission might be at a close, but our journey together to rebuild this parish is just beginning. In virtue of their baptism, all the members of the People of God have become missionary disciples (cf. Mt 28:19)....The new evangelization calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptized.

Every Christian is challenged, here and now.

Every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelization; indeed, anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love. Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are "disciples" and "missionaries", but rather that we are always "missionary disciples." (Evangellii Gaudium, 119)

St. Anthony de Padua Catholic School

- Seal your prayer by making the Sign of the Cross.
- Thank the Lord for your gifts: Recall, in your gratitude, that God made you a vessel to carry his light and love to others in your own special way. Sit for a few moments and search your heart for those gifts.
- Ask God how he wants you to serve him by serving in St. Anthony Parish. Fred Rogers once said, "Every one of us on this planet longs to know that there's something about us that's worth giving." And there is. God made us that way. Even if you are a person who cannot give care because you need to be cared for, you are giving the gift of allowing others to learn what it means to love their neighbor.
- Ask God to send the Holy Spirit to illuminate your talents, gifts, and interests. Remember, you have gifts written into your heart and mind at your creation that are worth giving.
- Ask Christ to walk with you as you discern which of those things to share.
- End by thanking God as you recall the blessings in your life.

2. Explore
