





When God speaks, he speaks in the form of a person: Jesus.

In the words and actions of Jesus, then and now, God speaks to us.



"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." (John 1:1) Here the Gospel of John sheds some light on why Jesus' teaching in the synagogue in this first chapter of Mark is so different and why even the unclean spirits obey him.

Jesus isn't just a prophet. He is *the* prophet. He is God's word in the flesh. This means his words have a power and authority that ordinary human beings do not. If he says "Be healed," we are healed. If he says "You are forgiven," we are forgiven. This means that we need to listen to his words, and follow them.

Talk

Here are some reflection questions to help you have **Great Conversations** with the whole family.

Do these things to encourage your child to listen to God:

- Ask your child how he or she thinks God might speak to us.
 Provide them time to think about the question. Let them offer a couple of ideas.
- Tell them that God is very different from us and speaks differently than we do. Isaiah puts this well when he says "as the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways." (Isaiah 55:9) This means that we should be prepared for God to speak to us in different ways than we speak to each other. It also means it takes time to learn how to listen to God.
- Use an example and tell them God loves them. If your family has a pet dog or cat, you can use an example of how different human speech is from the way animals communicate. We communicate our love to our pets by petting them, walking them and also by taking good care of them. God does something similar for us. Human words can't really capture everything God is saying, but he shows us his love through Jesus—God's Word made flesh.
- Read the Bible with your child. Start with the readings from this Sunday. Encourage your child to read them more than once and really think about what God is saying.



Have you ever noticed how we treat the words of Jesus at Mass?

On Sundays, the first two readings are found in a book called the Lectionary that waits to be read on the ambo. On the other hand, the book of the Gospels is treated differently: we carry it into Mass reverently and place it on the altar. Then, when it comes time to read the Gospel, we all stand up.

This is because the words of Jesus are different than the words of the prophets who came before him or the letters that were written about him. The words of prophets and apostles inspire us, but the words of Jesus *transform* us.

This makes all the difference in the world. We can count on what Jesus promises in a way that is so different from anyone else. Whatever thing we might fear: danger, death or even the devil himself, Jesus' words are more powerful than all those things. And if we listen to those words and follow them, they will lead us to eternal life.
