It is by our participation in the rites of the sacred Paschal Triduum that Christ invites us to become participants in his passion, death, and resurrection. During our time together we will look at a few hidden gems—prayer texts and ancient gestures unique to these Holy Week liturgies—as we prepare to receive Christ our Risen Lord into the sanctuary of our hearts and hail the victorious king of glory who conquers death and brings us newness of life.








## CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES RICE BOWL PROJECT —



## FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or of renewal of Baptism at Easter. (Code of Canon Law, 1249-1252)

**Good Friday, April 2, is a day of fast and abstinence.** Fridays of Lent are also days of abstinence. Fasting is to be observed by all eighteen years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their sixtieth birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all fourteen years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

# At Home with Faith

**God promised to write his law in our hearts.** That law is the love shared between the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We can see and express that law in our love for our family.



## Read

Take time to read and reflect on the Scriptures for this day.

Our first reading from Jeremiah promises a time when God will place his law within our hearts so that following him will become something that flows naturally from within us as opposed to something that must be imposed on us from the outside. That's the kind of obedience that Jesus offers in the Gospel reading. He willingly accepts his passion and crucifixion, despite all the pain it will bring, because he naturally longs to obey the Father's will.

**Pope Francis declared a special Year of the Family that begins on March 19, 2021 - the Feast of St. Joseph.** During this special year, we will continue to pay attention to the liturgical calendar while including ways to celebrate this special year.

### Jeremiah 31:31-34

I will place my law within their hearts, says the Lord.

Create a clean heart in me, O God!

### Hebrews 5:7-9

Jesus is the source of salvation for all.

### John 12:20-33

# At Home with Faith

## Talk

Here are some reflection questions to help you have **Great Conversations** with the whole family.

Do these four things to teach our our children how love is God's law written in our hearts:

- **Ask your child what they believe love is.** See what comes to mind for them. See if they describe love as an emotion or feeling. See if they describe it as doing something for someone.
- **Tell your child that Jesus taught that love has two parts: 1) seeing the other person as good, and 2) doing what is good for them.** This means you can affirm them if they talked about the emotional aspects of love and you can affirm them if they talked about being kind to another person. Let them know that you always see them as good and you do what is good for them, even if it doesn't make them happy at the time.
- **Let them know love is a gift from God.** God gives us the ability to love. In fact, it's God's love that brings us into being. Also, God always does the good thing for us, even if it might not feel like it at the time.
- **Encourage them to ask God for help in loving better.** If we ask God, he can help us love more. We can pray to him to help us love our brothers and sisters more. We can also pray to him to help us choose the right way to direct our love. This is one of the ways he fulfills his promise to write his law within our hearts.

# CELEBRATE WITH YOUR FAMILY



**During this special Year of the Family, Pope Francis encourages us to revisit his apostolic exhortation *Amoris Laetitia* (The Joy of Love) on the 5th anniversary of its publication.** We will use this space to take a closer look at the many ways our family life can reflect this vision for The Joy of Love.

In the 11th Paragraph of *Amoris Laetitia*, Pope Francis writes "The triune God is a communion of Love, and the family is its living reflection." In this, he is echoing the writings of Pope John Paul II and the Second Vatican Council which describe the family as "a school of deeper Humanity." (GS 52) In other words, the way the family lives (or should live) reflects the way that the Father, Son and Holy Spirit love with complete freedom and generosity.

Though none of our families fully realize God's plan, we are all called to a conversion of heart that lets us love our family more and more as God does. We are also called to let our children know that our love for them flows from the love God has placed within our hearts. Everything we do for them is a gift from God.
