When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, Mary, the mother of James, and Salome bought spices so that they might go and anoint him. Very early when the sun had risen, on the first day of the week, they came to the tomb. They were saying to one another, “Who will roll back the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?” When they looked up, they saw that the stone had been rolled back; it was very large. On entering the tomb they saw a young man sitting on the right side, clothed in a white robe, and they were utterly amazed. He said to them, “Do not be amazed! You seek Jesus of Nazareth, the crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Behold the place where they laid him. But go and tell his disciples and Peter, ‘He is going before you to Galilee; there you will see him, as he told you.’” *Mark 16:1-7*

At Home with Faith

Easter Sunday is the start of a joyful, 50-day season. After the resurrection, Jesus patiently taught the disciples about his plan for them. Let's pay attention to what Jesus is teaching the disciples, and us, through this Easter season.



It's been a year since, under the shadow of COVID19, we celebrated Easter without being able to celebrate Mass in person ([click here](#) to see Archbishop's Easter Mass from 2020). Now, we are gradually returning to so many of the things we have missed.

In a similar way, at the first Easter, the disciples only gradually discovered the meaning of Jesus' resurrection. The readings of the Easter season show Jesus walking them through how his death and resurrection fulfills his Father's plan. We parents can follow along with the readings during the Easter season, teaching our children that, even after we receive the sacraments, it takes time for God to work on our hearts forming us as his people ready to receive and share his grace.

Talk

Here are some reflection questions to help you have **Great Conversations** with the whole family.

Invite your children to reflect on what Easter morning might have felt like:

- **Ask your children to remember back to Palm Sunday Mass.** What do you think Peter felt like after he denied Jesus three times? Maybe guilty. How about Mary and everyone who saw Jesus die? What were they thinking and feeling when they woke up on Easter morning?
- **Ask your children what they think the disciples would have thought and felt upon discovering the empty tomb.** Remind your children that, unlike us, the disciples didn't know to expect Jesus to rise from the dead. Do you think they were a little confused? They probably didn't understand what was happening!
- **Tell your children about how you felt when they were born.** New beginnings are exciting and beautiful, but they can also be confusing. It can take some time to understand what is happening. It's the same way with faith.
- **Let your children know it takes time to know what Jesus is doing in our lives.** Encourage them to be patient. Let them know we are still learning too.

CELEBRATE WITH YOUR FAMILY



In paragraph #317 of *Amoris Laetitia*, The Joy of Love, Pope Francis tells us:

“If a family is centered on Christ, he will unify and illuminate its entire life ... moments of joy, relaxation, celebration, and even sexuality can be experienced as a sharing in the full life of the resurrection. Married couples shape with different daily gestures a ‘God-enlightened space in which to experience the hidden presence of the risen Lord.’”

After Jesus' resurrection, the disciples found an empty tomb. Jesus patiently worked with the disciples to help them understand what had happened. In doing this, he was teaching them how to recognize his presence in places they might not expect. He was preparing them to teach others about experiencing the hidden presence of the risen Lord in every part of our lives.

God's plan from the beginning was for us to share in his ongoing work of creation, and his joy. Over this Easter season, let's pay close attention to what Jesus does with the disciples so we can be more prepared to discover how Jesus brings joy to our families.
