“Final Flurry of Preparation for the Archbishop’s Visit” Parish Work Day: **July 31st 8:00-10:00**


We are starting early to beat the summer heat.

DELTA VARIANT AND MASKING—

From the Archdiocese

The Delta variant, which is highly transmissible, is now widespread across the United States and has quadrupled the case count this month alone. Reports acknowledge that even people who have been vaccinated may still transmit the virus and be infected by this Delta variant. Because of this, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has updated its masking guidance, **recommending that everyone wear masks in indoor public spaces – even if they’ve been vaccinated.**

Due to the risks of the Delta variant and our desire to protect our children and the vulnerable in our communities, **we are recommending mask wearing during indoor Mass celebrations.**

Celebrating their Quinceanera –
Fifteenth Birthday
Saint John Vianney Church -
July 24, 2021



Quinceañera means “one who is fifteen.” A Quinceañera is the celebration of a girl’s fifteenth birthday, marked by the Church’s Blessing of her passage from childhood to womanhood. Last Saturday July 24, 2021 at the 5:00pm Mass Stephanie and Ashley Lopez-Valadez celebrated their Quinceanera and received the Church’s Blessing on that special occasion in their life.

What is a Quinceanera? What is the origin of a Quinceanera?

Over the course of time, people of all cultures and eras have celebrated the coming of age of their children. The origin of the quinceañera is a coming-of-age blessing and cultural ritual in Hispanic and Latino cultures. It is linked to ancient Aztecs rites of passage, around 500 B.C.

At age fifteen, Aztec boys were inducted as warriors, while girls were honored for their capacity to give new warriors to the community. The future of their tribe depended on them. It is said that during the ceremony, the King himself would instruct the fifteen-year-old Aztec girl in the duties of womanhood. An Aztec woman who happened to die in childbirth received the same honors at her funeral as a warrior who had fallen in battle.

With the Spanish conquest, the Aztec rite of passage tradition was Christianized and the quinceañera evolved into a rite of social initiation intended to teach and reinforce important Christian values. Among several Spanish-speaking countries and many Hispanics in the United States there is the custom of celebrating a young woman’s passage from childhood to adolescence with a ritual that expresses thanksgiving to God for the gift of life and that asks for a blessing from God for the years ahead. It is an opportunity for the parish to accompany the young woman and her family at an important of celebration and thanksgiving in their lives.

Today, a Quinceañera is a celebration of thanksgiving for a young girl’s life and her passage into womanhood. Her parents, relatives, and friends ask God to pour his blessings and protection upon her as she matures into a young woman. The celebration is not a sacrament but an act of thanksgiving on the part of the young girl turning fifteen and his/her parents and godparents. It is an opportunity for the young girl to renew her commitment to her faith.

The Quinceanera Blessing is a unique opportunity for the parish to accompany a young woman and her family at an important time in their life. This celebration can be an opportune moment to bring the young woman and her family and friends to an encounter with Christ and his Church.
