Part III: Faith Formation

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ & Friends of St. John Vianney:

In my *Pastor's Thoughts* letter last week, I wrote about how important faith formation is in our lives. A disciple of Jesus recognizes that faith formation is crucial for their life-long relationship with the Lord, and for their life as a Catholic. Faith formation helps to restore and renew that relationship. This week in *Pastor's Thoughts* we're going to look at our parish family's Faith Formation ministry and how you and I participate in it.... We all have a role and a responsibility!

Discipleship, the work of the Church, is the restoration and renewal of the world with the message of the Gospel. In word and sacrament; faith and action; and in charity and justice, we grow in holiness and love, and we build a Civilization of Love (the Kingdom of God). If you look at our parish prayer for the year, it echoes these aspects of discipleship... "In our celebration and adoration of the Eucharist, and in our works of service, charity and justice, may we come to know and love Jesus more deeply and experience His true joy in our lives." Discipleship begins with our active engagement with the Gospel! Faith formation, as a life-long endeavor supports and sustains us as members of God's family, the Church. In the restoration and renewal of our parish family life and ministries in this next year as we engage the Archdiocese Pastoral Planning Process, focusing on the renewal of faith formation in our families and in our parish, family is the keystone to knowing the Lord and embracing his mission.

Family is Everything! The family is the framework that God set out for human sanctification. Holiness in the human experience achieved its highest moment in the mystery of the Incarnation when God became flesh and Jesus became one of us as a member of a family. The family as the Domestic Church is where our faith and love are fostered, and we grow in holiness through our participation in our family's life.

Our families – your family and my family – are paths to holiness. They are (imperfect) reflections of the holiness and love of God present in the first holy family of Jesus, Mary & Joseph. Nonetheless, our participation in our family's life is what God hopes for and intends. Both in our blood family of the Domestic Church, and in our parish family, our participation in our faith life/faith formation is what strengthens and grows the gifts of faith, charity, love, forgiveness, justice, mercy and service, etc. in us. Catechesis (faith formation) done within the context of the family is the best form of faith formation, and is what the Church intends for how the path to our holiness is best accomplished.

As I mentioned in last week's *Pastor's Thoughts* letter, we will be changing the course of focus of on Faith Formation to embrace an inter-generational model, that truly reflects how we share and live faith in the life of our families. What's IFF all about and what will it look like here at SJV?

Intergenerational Faith Formation (IFF) will help us to come to know Jesus and embrace his mission by making Christ Jesus (more) the center of our lives and the center of learning and sharing about our faith as Catholics. As a parish family, Intergenerational Faith Formation will give us an opportunity to learn from each other and share our faith with each other just as we do in our own families. IFF will also help us to come to know Jesus Christ more by leading us to a greater engagement of the Church's Mission in word, sacrament, works of mercy and justice. IFF will help us come to know and love Jesus all the more my drawing us deeper into the heart of the Mass and the liturgy. The Mass is always our first teacher in the ways of faith...It's where our faith is first caught and taught, and where we encounter the Lord in worship.

Beginning in October, once a month (usually on the 2nd Sunday of the month), will be "Faith Formation Sunday", where we'll gather in the Parish Hall after Mass for about 90 minutes for prayer, food, faith-sharing, fellowship, and fun. Each Faith Formation Sunday will begin with prayer/morning prayer, watch a video presentation, and then breaking off into smaller cohorts or groups pertaining to our age groups, (for instance: young children, youth, adults, etc.) we'll talk about what we learned. We're going to start the year off by learning together about the Mass by doing a Biblical Walk-Thru of the Mass. Additionally, in the "off" Sundays when we are not meeting, I'm going to have a short (5 question) online quiz for anyone and everyone to take that will focus on the Mass... asking fun questions about Mass and usually the Mass that we celebrated together that weekend. Last year with our Confirmation preparation, I prepared weekly quizzes for the Confirmandi and their parents, and they seemed to enjoy taking these quizzes. We'll begin them on the first weekend in October, and so I will have more to tell you about them then. I just know that doing Faith Formation intergenerationally will be much fun for all of us, and reap enormous fruit and blessings in our lives.

Fr. David, have a great trip. Fr. Fred, we look forward to seeing you.




USCCB Action Alerts For Immigration Reform
