

5th Sunday of Easter: THE CHRISTIAN TRADEMARK...

It is often said that Jesus gave a new commandment to his disciples; as a matter of fact, Jesus only summed up the Ten Commandments given to Moses by God into two. Loving God consists of the first three commandments and loving your neighbor as yourself comprises fourth through tenth commandments. However, the newness of Jesus's commandment lay in its range and application. For example, whereas the neighbor that a Jew was required to love in the Old Testament was another Jew, for a disciple of Jesus, the neighbor is EVERY man and women, friend and foe alike. Don't say this is impossible, there have been cases recorded in history when someone actually did that physically, morally and sometimes symbolically. It is called sacrifice: example of this is St. Maximillian Kobe.
