

Parish Updates


St. Vincent De Paul: Our Christmas Food Box Project was a huge success due in large part to the generosity of our supporters within and outside the parish. Thanks to each of you. We were able to provide Christmas Food Boxes to 100 local people in need. Boxes included meat, fresh produce, baking mixes, salad kits, canned goods, peanut butter and jelly, bread, tea, Christmas Candy and much more. We had hygiene supplies from the LaSalle high Spanish classes, nicely bagged and ready to be put into the boxes. What a bonus! And over 40 people volunteered to pack boxes, pick up food, deliver boxes and clean up. We are truly blessed in this endeavor.

Our next Food Collection Weekend is January 8-9th. Our pantry needs the following this month: blankets, dish and/or laundry soap, shampoo, toothbrushes, deodorant and razors. Bags with lists of needed items are on the table in the back of the church. Please take a bag, fill it with needed items and return it next weekend. And thank you for your continuing support.

Faith Formation



No Faith Formation session today, January 2. Sessions will resume on Sunday, January 9, 2022.

There will be a meeting on **Sunday**, **January 16 at 11:15am** for all parents preparing their children for the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

On Sunday, January 9 at 11am, we will offer our annual *Called to Protect Training* for all children in grades Kindergarten through High School and their parents. This training is mandatory on a yearly basis for children and youth to learn how to develop boundaries to protect themselves, to recognize when their boundaries are being violated, and encourage them to tell a parent or trusted adult when their boundaries are violated. All materials are age appropriate.

Dear Friends,

The Epiphany is celebrated on January 6 in the Western Church, which happens to land 12 days after Christmas Day. Here in the United States, to have more participation of the faithful, we celebrate Epiphany on the Sunday between January 2 and 8. Epiphany simply means "revelation" and has other names such as Theophany or Three Kings' Day. It is a day closely associated with Christmas, so much so that in the Eastern Church, Epiphany is also a celebration of Christ's birth.

The Epiphany, within the Western Church, celebrates the arrival of the Gentile (non-Jewish) Magi to the crib of Christ incarnate. This seemingly simple storyline in the Gospel of Matthew reveals something very powerful about the epiphany or "revelation" of God to both the Jewish people and the entire world. It is a vision and manifestation to all the nations that Christ is savior of the world.

There are a variety of traditions that are associated with this feast. In Spain and some Latin countries, one custom is to give small gifts to children and place them in their shoes, I suppose a double take on the idea that the magi journeyed (shoes) to offer their gifts to the child Jesus. In the Filipino culture, Christmas and the Epiphany are highlighted by the *parol*, symbolizing the bright shining star that have guided the magi to the manger. And on the reprise in recent years (which can easily be Googled) is the chalking of door posts with the year and initials of the three kings (example: 20+C+M+B+22) as a way of inviting and blessing all guests who enter our homes.

As a family, how do you wish to celebrate this day, the feast of the Epiphany? What tradition can you begin this year, so as to allow the star of Bethlehem to shine brighter in our homes and families? In whatever you do, may the Light of Christ be with you always.
