

Parish Updates

Synod on Synodality. A Synod is not just a convening of Bishops reflecting on a particular topic and advising the Pope. A Synod is a journey of discernment, in which the people of God are called to pray and reflect upon the Holy Spirit's will for the Church. Through our listening and our sharing, we will seek to understand what the Holy Spirit's will is for the topic being discussed – and thus, for the Church.

For the 2023 Ordinary Synod of Bishops, that topic is synodality. Simply put, synodality is discerning how the Spirit is moving through and with the Body of Christ, so that we may continue to fulfill our mission to evangelize in the world.

There will be a time when the synodal process asks our parish participation sometime in February and March. I pray that everyone will participate in the discussions and reflection questions. Watch for more information.

Faith Formation

Faith Formation sessions resume today, Jan. 9.

Today, all our children in Faith Formation will undergo our annual *Called to Protect Training*. This training is mandatory on a yearly basis for children and youth to learn how to develop boundaries to protect themselves, to recognize when their boundaries are being violated, and encourage them to tell a parent or trusted adult when their boundaries are violated. All materials are age appropriate.

There will be a meeting on **Sunday**, **January 16 at 11:15am** for all parents preparing their children for the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

Our four children preparing for the Sacrament of the Holy Communion this coming April just had their first Sacrament of Reconciliation on Saturday, Jan. 8. Please keep them in your prayers.

Mark your calendars for **May 18 at 6:30PM for the Confirmation Mass** with Archbishop Sample at the St. Therese Church. Six youth from our parish will receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this year.

This Sunday we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, a scene described in the Gospels of Matthew (Year A), Mark (Year B) and Luke (Year C), all with varying descriptions, timelines and perspectives. Regardless of the Gospel account, the overall picture presented to us is of an event that was as poignant in the early ministry of Jesus. Those who witnessed this Baptism of the Lord experienced something new and wonderful at work through this person of Jesus of Nazareth.

Last week, I made mention of the close connection between Christmas day and the Epiphany. In fact, the two go hand-in-hand. The same can be said of the Epiphany

and the celebration of the Baptism of the Lord. At heart, these celebrations are revelations of the identity of this Jesus.

In the Epiphany, Jesus is identified as the king of the nations, of both the Jewish people and the Gentiles. In his Baptism, something more of his identity is revealed. He is a chosen one, a child of God—indeed—God's beloved.

Most of us who gather in our pews are baptized Christians. I'd like to extend an invitation to those among us who are not baptized, and to parents who have not yet baptized their children. Please consider learning about this wonderful sacrament which is an experience of claiming our own identity in Christ as beloved children of God.

For those of us who are baptized, another invitation is offered. We are asked to reflect on our experience of knowing the person of Jesus Christ, and to remind ourselves of our baptismal vows. Some ideas may include using holy water in the home or always starting and ending our prayers with the sign of the cross.

Whatever we do, may we be reminded that we are claimed and loved by the God who has revealed Himself to us.
